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प्रवेशार्थी विवरणिका – सत्र 2025–26

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1. ऑनलाइन प्रवेश संबंधी नियम सत्र 2025–26

- स्नातक व स्नातकोत्तर प्रथम वर्ष में प्रवेश हेमवती नन्दन बहुगुणा गढ़वाल केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित नीतियों, निर्देशों तथा प्रक्रिया के अनुसार HNBGU SAMARTH पोर्टल के माध्यम से किये जायेंगे। प्रवेश हेतु इच्छुक अभ्यर्थी को महाविद्यालय की वेबसाइट www.davpgcollegeddn.ac.in में प्रवेश हेतु दिये गये लिंक को क्लिक करके प्रवेश प्रक्रिया में पंजीकरण करके दी गयी अन्य अनिवार्य शर्तें पूर्ण करनी होंगी। वेबसाइट/ महाविद्यालय पोर्टल में वर्णित दिशा निर्देशों का पूर्ण अनुपालन किया जाना प्रत्येक अभ्यर्थी के लिये अनिवार्य होगा।
- ऑनलाइन प्रक्रिया में समस्त अभ्यर्थियों को प्रवेश हेतु जन्मतिथि के प्रमाण हेतु हाईस्कूल तथा समकक्ष प्रमाण-पत्र की स्वप्रमाणित छायाप्रति, अर्हकारी परीक्षा की अंकतालिका की स्वप्रमाणित छायाप्रति, स्थानान्तरण प्रमाण-पत्र मूल रूप में (महाविद्यालय में पहली बार प्रवेशार्थी के लिए अनिवार्य), CUET प्रवेश पत्र व परिणाम (अंक सूची), आरक्षण संबंधी वर्ग (अनुसूचित जाति, अनुसूचित जनजाति, अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग (नॉन क्रिमी लेयर) तथा भूतपूर्व सैनिक तथा उनके आश्रित, दिव्यांग होने का प्रमाण-पत्र तथा स्वतंत्रता संग्राम सेनानियों के आश्रित होने) का प्रमाण-पत्र भी यथा स्थान पर अपलोड करना होगा। संबंधित आरक्षित वर्ग के वैध प्रमाण-पत्र अपलोड न होने की स्थिति में आरक्षण का लाभ नहीं दिया जा सकेगा। इसके अतिरिक्त पुलिस सत्यापन के प्रमाण-पत्र पर अभ्यर्थी के स्वयं तथा अभिभावक के हस्ताक्षर होने चाहिए। रैगिंग संबंधी शपथ-पत्र तथा पूर्व संस्था के प्राचार्य अथवा किसी राजपत्रित अधिकारी द्वारा दिया गया चरित्र प्रमाण-पत्र (वैधता अवधि 6 माह) भी आवश्यकतानुसार अपलोड करना अनिवार्य होगा।
- प्रवेशार्थी का दायित्व होगा कि वे समय-समय पर महाविद्यालय की वेबसाइट का अवलोकन करता रहे तथा दिये गये दिशा-निर्देशों के अनुसार वरीयता सूची में स्थान पाने पर निर्धारित शुल्क इत्यादि निर्धारित तिथि तक जमा कर दे।
- प्रवेश हेतु अधिमानीत अंक (वेटेज) महाविद्यालय द्वारा तभी दिया जा सकेगा जब अभ्यर्थी ने नियमानुसार वैध खेलकूद, एनसीसी, एनएसएस, स्कॉउट रोवर्स एवं रेंजर का प्रमाण-पत्र अपलोड कर दिया हो।

2. प्रवेश सम्बन्धी नियम 2025–26

- UG व PG प्रथम वर्ष में प्रवेश क्रमशः CUET एवं विश्वविद्यालय प्रवेश परीक्षा (UET) की मेरिट आधारित व ऑनलाइन होंगे। प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र ऑनलाइन जमा कर देना कॉलेज में प्रवेश का आश्वासन नहीं है।
- प्रवेश विवरणिका अच्छी प्रकार पढ़ लें। इसमें दिए प्रावधान तथा नियम कॉलेज और विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा यथासमय

परिवर्तनीय हैं।

- उत्तराखण्ड सरकार द्वारा अनुदानित डी.ए.वी. कॉलेज, देहरादून मूलतः जनपद के निवासियों की शैक्षणिक आवश्यकताओं की पूर्ति हेतु है, अतः प्रवेश में स्थानीय छात्रों को वरीयता दी जाती है।
- सभी कक्षाओं में प्रवेश हेतु 90 प्रतिशत सीटें उत्तराखण्ड के अधिवासियों के लिए होंगी। प्रदेश के बाहर के अभ्यर्थियों को अधिकतम 10 प्रतिशत सीटों पर ही प्रवेश मिल सकेगा, बशर्तें वे सामान्य वरीयता सूची में अर्ह हों। अर्हता के अभाव में उत्तराखण्ड से बाहर की रिक्त सीटों को उत्तराखण्ड के अभ्यर्थियों की सूची से प्रवेश दिया जाएगा।
- कृपया अपना प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र भरते समय जाँच लें कि—
 - प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र विधिवत भरे गये हैं तथा इसमें निर्धारित स्थान पर आपके तथा आपके अभिभावक के हस्ताक्षर हैं।
 - प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र में आपका नवीनतम फोटोग्राफ तथा पता होना अनिवार्य है।
 - किसी अन्य विश्वविद्यालय से अर्हकारी परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण होने पर उस विश्वविद्यालय का प्रवजन प्रमाण पत्र (Migration Certificate) मूल रूप में छात्र विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा आवेदन-पत्र के साथ अपलोड करें।
- सही एवं स्पष्ट रूप से भरा हुआ प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र निर्धारित तिथि तक प्राप्त हो जाना चाहिए। आवेदन-पत्र के साथ प्रमाण-पत्रों की स्वप्रमाणित प्रतिलिपियाँ संलग्न/अपलोड करना आवश्यक है। महाविद्यालय के प्रवेश-फार्म पर छात्र/छात्रा का वही नाम मान्य होगा जो कि उसके हाई-स्कूल या समकक्ष परीक्षा के प्रमाणपत्र पर अंकित होगा। उपनाम अनुमन्य नहीं है।

7. प्रवेश शुल्क का भुगतान 'ऑनलाइन' ही किया जायेगा। विस्तृत दिशा निर्देशों हेतु महाविद्यालय की वेबसाइट देखें।

- अपूर्ण आवेदन-पत्रों पर विचार नहीं किया जायेगा। आवेदन-पत्र जमा/अपलोड करने की अन्तिम तिथि के पश्चात् किसी भी प्रकार का कोई प्रपत्र आवेदन-पत्र में संलग्न/अपलोड नहीं किया जा सकेगा।
- ड्रॉप आउट्स व अनुचित साधन प्रयोग के दोषी या दोषारोपित छात्रों को किसी भी अन्य विषय या कक्षा में प्रवेश नहीं दिया जायेगा। यदि वे इस तथ्य को छिपाकर प्रवेश ले लेते हैं, तो जानकारी होने पर तुरंत उनका प्रवेश बिना किसी नोटिस के निरस्त कर दिया जायेगा। महाविद्यालय के नियमित छात्र जो परीक्षा में सम्मिलित नहीं हुए (अर्थात् ड्रॉपर्स हैं) पुनः प्रवेश के पात्र नहीं होंगे।
- उन प्रवेशार्थियों को जिनके परीक्षाफल अनुचित साधन के अतिरिक्त किसी अन्य कारण से रोके गये हैं, अपने आवेदन-पत्र निर्धारित अंतिम तिथि तक अवश्य जमा करा देने चाहिए।
- दुराचरण अथवा अनवरत प्रमाद के दोषी छात्र को अर्धदण्ड सहित निलम्बित, निष्कासित, बहिष्कृत या विश्वविद्यालय

परीक्षा से वंचित किया जा सकता है। जिन छात्रों की गतिविधियाँ नियंता मण्डल/प्रशासन की राय में अवांछनीय है, उन्हें प्रवेश देने से रोका जा सकता है अथवा उनका प्रवेश निरस्त किया जा सकता है। शासकीय आदेश संख्या अ0शा0 2421/15-10-87/134/86 दिनांक 8 मई, 1987 के अनुसार अवांछनीय तत्वों अथवा अध्ययन में रुचि न रखने वाले छात्र/छात्राओं को प्रवेश से वंचित किया जा सकता है। यदि प्रवेश दिया जा चुका है, तो इस तथ्य का पता लगने पर प्रवेश निरस्त किया जा सकता है।

12. अपने प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र के साथ अंक-तालिका या जाति/अधिमान प्रमाण-पत्रों की मूल प्रति संलग्न न करें। केवल स्व-प्रमाणित प्रतियाँ ही लगायें। मूल-प्रतियाँ साक्षात्कार/सत्यापन/प्रवेश काउंसलिंग के समय प्रस्तुत करने के लिए बुलाया जा सकता है।
13. प्रवेशार्थियों को चेतावनी दी जाती है कि वे अपने आवेदन-पत्रों में कोई असत्य सूचना न दें और न ही कोई तथ्य छिपाएँ। उनके द्वारा प्रस्तुत अंक-तालिका और प्रमाण-पत्रों की प्रतिलिपियाँ सम्बन्धित विश्वविद्यालय/परीक्षा निकायों को सत्यापन हेतु भेजी जा सकती हैं। सत्यापन के उपरान्त यदि कोई पत्रजात (Document) असत्य पाया जाता है तो न केवल प्रवेश निरस्त कर दिया जायेगा, अपितु कानूनी कार्रवाई भी की जायेगी।
14. वरीयता सूची में चयन के बाद अभ्यर्थी को महाविद्यालय का प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्र सभी वांछित प्रमाण-पत्रों सहित कार्यालय में प्रस्तुत करना होगा। सभी प्रमाण-पत्रों के सही पाये जाने पर ही प्रवेश समिति द्वारा प्रवेश की संस्तुति की जाएगी।
15. उपस्थिति पंजिका में किसी भी छात्र/छात्रा का नाम सम्बन्धित प्राध्यापक द्वारा तभी लिखा जायेगा, जबकि छात्र/छात्रा फीस रसीद एवं प्रामाणिक परिचय-पत्र उन्हें दिखायेगा।
16. महाविद्यालय किसी अभ्यर्थी को प्रवेश सम्बन्धी सूचना देने के लिए बाध्य नहीं होगा। प्रवेश के इच्छुक अभ्यर्थियों का दायित्व है कि वह समय-समय पर महाविद्यालय की वेबसाइट तथा सम्बन्धित विभाग के सूचना पट्ट पर लगने वाली सूचनायें प्राप्त करें।
17. मिथ्या/अपूर्ण सूचनायें प्रस्तुत करने पर किसी भी छात्र को महाविद्यालय से निष्कासित किया जा सकता है, अगर त्रुटिवश या मिथ्या सूचना के आधार पर किसी छात्र/छात्रा को प्रवेश प्राप्त हो गया हो तो ऐसे तथ्यों के प्रकाश में आने पर संबंधित अनियमित प्रवेश को निरस्त करने का विधि सम्मत अधिकार प्राचार्य का होगा।
18. महाविद्यालय को बिना कोई कारण दिये प्रवेश न देने/निरस्त करने का अधिकार है। प्राचार्य द्वारा कोई भी प्रवेश कभी भी बिना कोई कारण बताये निरस्त किया जा सकता है।
19. जिन छात्रों ने पिछले वर्ष पुस्तकालय की पुस्तकें वापिस नहीं की हैं उन्हें प्रवेश तभी दिया जायेगा, जब वे पुस्तकें वापस कर देंगे।

20. 'ओपन स्कूल' से पाँच विषय लेकर प्लस-टू परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण छात्र स्नातक कक्षाओं में प्रवेश के लिए अर्ह होंगे।
21. विश्वविद्यालय के नियमानुसार महाविद्यालय की प्रत्येक कक्षा में Casual Admission पूर्णतः वर्जित है।
22. एम.एस-सी. कक्षाओं में किसी अन्य महाविद्यालय/विश्वविद्यालय अथवा इसी कॉलेज की अन्य कक्षाओं से किसी भी परिस्थिति में स्थानान्तरण की अनुमति नहीं है।
23. प्रवेश लेने के पश्चात् सभी छात्र/छात्रायें अपने परिचय पत्र (Identity Card) चीफ प्रॉक्टर कार्यालय में हस्ताक्षर के लिए स्वयं ही उपस्थित हों। अपना पहचान पत्र किसी अन्य को न दें।
24. सभी छात्र/छात्रायें लाइब्रेरी कार्ड बनाने के लिए पुस्तकालय में निर्धारित काउन्टर पर स्वयं ही उपस्थित होकर अपना लाइब्रेरी कार्ड बनवायें।
25. प्रवेश सम्बन्धी सभी सूचनायें तथा आवेदन-पत्र जमा किये जाने की अंतिम तिथि, योग्यता सूची, प्रवेश हेतु चयन, शुल्क जमा करने की अंतिम तिथि आदि केवल विभागीय/कॉलेज सूचना पट्ट/वेबसाइट के माध्यम से प्रसारित की जायेगी। इसलिये सभी प्रवेशार्थियों से अपेक्षा की जाती है कि वे कॉलेज/विभागों के सूचना पट्ट/वेबसाइट निरन्तर देखते रहें।
26. **शुल्क रसीद सुरक्षित रखनी चाहिए, क्योंकि संरक्षित-निधि (Security Money) वापस लेते समय इसे तत्संबंधी प्रार्थना-पत्र के साथ कार्यालय में जमा करना होता है। विद्यार्थी द्वारा जमा की गई जमानत राशि अन्तिम परीक्षा पास किये जाने के एक वर्ष के अंतर्गत उनके द्वारा वापस मांगी जा सकती है। उपरोक्त समय बीत जाने पर वह राशि स्वतः जब्त हो जायेगी और वापस नहीं होगी।**
27. शुल्क विमुक्ति के लिए यथा समय निर्धारित प्रपत्र पर आवेदन अवश्य कर दें।
28. छात्र/छात्राओं को स्नातक डिग्री तथा स्नातकोत्तर डिग्री विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित अधिकतम समय सीमा में पूर्ण करनी होगी, जोकि निम्नांकित है:
(a) All UG courses (except B.Ed.) and PG – courses duration + 2 years
(b) B.Ed. – course duration + 1 year
29. जनपद देहरादून में नौकरी करने वाले अभ्यर्थियों को अपने विभाग से कक्षाओं में उपस्थित होने हेतु अनापत्ति प्रमाण-पत्र (N.O.C.) प्रस्तुत करना अनिवार्य है, लेकिन जनपद देहरादून से बाहर नौकरी करने वाले अभ्यर्थी प्रवेश के पात्र नहीं होंगे।
30. विषय/संकाय एक बार आवंटित होने पर परिवर्तन नहीं किया जायेगा।
31. अनुत्तीर्ण होने वाले छात्रों को उसी कक्षा एवं संकाय में प्रवेश नहीं दिया जायेगा।
32. **प्रवेश व उपस्थिति सम्बन्धी समस्त नियमों में हेमवती नन्दन बहुगुणा गढ़वाल विश्वविद्यालय के नियम लागू होंगे।**
33. विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा अनुमन्य सीटों के अनुरूप ही प्रवेश दिए जायेंगे।
34. अनन्तिम प्रवेश हेतु आधार कार्ड नम्बर अनिवार्य होगा।



35. व्यवसायिक पाठ्यक्रम—बी.एड. तथा एल.एल.बी. छात्र/छात्राओं को निर्धारित यूनिफार्म में महाविद्यालय में आना अनिवार्य होगा।
36. अर्हता परीक्षा पास करने के पश्चात् दो या अधिक वर्ष का समय अन्तराल हो गया है और प्रवेश की सभी शर्तों का अनुपालन करता है तो महाविद्यालय उसे भी प्रवेश दे सकता है। परन्तु उसे इस समय अन्तराल का शपथ पत्र भर कर देना होना जिसमें समय अन्तराल का कारण स्पष्ट हो जिससे महाविद्यालय का सक्षम अधिकारी सन्तुष्ट हो।
37. स्नातक कक्षाओं के लिए आवेदकों को पुनः उसी कक्षा में किसी विषय या स्कूल में अध्ययन हेतु प्रवेश नहीं दिया जायेगा जिस कक्षा का उन्होंने पास कर लिया है। उदाहरण के तौर पर बी.एस—सी. पास करने वाले विद्यार्थी बी.एस—सी. में किसी दूसरे भिन्न विषयों के समूह के साथ या बी.ए./बी.कॉम. में प्रवेश नहीं ले सकते हैं। हालांकि स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं में एक बार किसी विषय में स्नातकोत्तर परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण करने के पश्चात् किसी दूसरे विषय में अर्हता पूर्ण करने के लिए उपरान्त योग्यताक्रमानुसार प्रवेश दिया जा सकता है।

3. अध्ययन-पाठ्यक्रम

विषय चयन सम्बन्धी सूचना पढ़कर ही विषयों का चयन करें। गलत विषय चयन करने के पश्चात् होने वाली हानि का उत्तरदायित्व केवल छात्र का ही होगा।

टिप्पणी

1. बी0ए0 प्रथम वर्ष के छात्र भूगोल, चित्रकला व मनोविज्ञान विषयों का चयन तभी कर सकते हैं जब उन्होंने उक्त विषय में अर्हकारी परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण की हो। भूगोल विषय चयन करने हेतु गणित अथवा जीवविज्ञान के साथ उत्तीर्ण विद्यार्थी भी अर्ह होंगे।
2. गणित के साथ केवल सांख्यिकी, अर्थशास्त्र तथा भूगोल विषय ही लिये जा सकते हैं।
3. संगीत विषय वे ही अभ्यर्थी ले सकते हैं जिनका 10+2 में संगीत विषय रहा हो या जिन्होंने भातखण्डे अथवा प्रयाग संगीत समिति से मध्यमा/सीनियर डिप्लोमा/चार वर्षीय पाठ्यक्रम उत्तीर्ण किया हो। अन्य प्रतिभावान अभ्यर्थी यदि संगीत विषय लेने का इच्छुक हो तो विभागाध्यक्ष/संकायाध्यक्ष उसकी स्वर परीक्षा लेकर प्रवेश संस्तुत कर सकते हैं।
4. स्नातक (बी.ए.) स्तर पर केवल वही छात्र गणित विषय का चयन कर सकेंगे जिन्होंने अर्हकारी परीक्षा में गणित का अध्ययन किया हो।
5. महाविद्यालय प्रशासन द्वारा विभिन्न विषयों में स्नातक स्तर (कला) पर शिक्षकों की उपलब्धता के आधार पर छात्र हित में सीटें निर्धारित की जा सकती हैं जो कि

समस्त अभ्यर्थियों को मान्य होगी।

- (2) विज्ञान स्नातक पाठ्यक्रम (बी.एस—सी. NEP-2020) उपाधि हेतु बी.एस—सी. उपाधि में निम्न विषय समूह उपलब्ध है: रसायन विज्ञान, वनस्पति विज्ञान एवं प्राणि विज्ञान, भौतिकी, गणित व सांख्यिकी

- सभी संकायों के प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश सीटों की उपलब्धता एवं मेरिट के आधार पर ही निर्धारित तिथि तक किये जायेंगे। स्नातक स्तर पर NEP आधारित पाठ्यक्रम लागू हो चुका है। विवरण पृष्ठ 28 से 46 पर दिया गया है।
- बी.एससी. में छात्र/छात्रा उसी संवर्ग (विषय समूह) में प्रवेश ले सकेंगे जिसका अध्ययन उन्होंने अर्हकारी परीक्षा में किया हो। इस प्रतिबन्ध का आशय यह है कि जिन छात्र/छात्राओं ने 10+2 स्तर पर गणित संवर्ग (भौतिक, रसायन एवं गणित) विषयों का अध्ययन किया हो वह गणित संवर्ग तथा जिन छात्रों ने जीव विज्ञान संवर्ग (रसायन, वनस्पति एवं जन्तु विज्ञान) का अध्ययन किया हो वह जीव विज्ञान संवर्ग (Life Science Group) में ही प्रवेश ले सकेंगे।
- स्नातक कक्षाओं में प्रत्येक विषय का एक आन्तरिक आंकलन/परीक्षा 30 अंक की होगी तथा विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा 70 अंक की होगी। आन्तरिक आंकलन/परीक्षा में भाग लेना विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा में बैठने हेतु अनिवार्य होगा।

5. स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं में प्रवेश हेतु नियम

स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं में प्रवेश (UET) विश्वविद्यालय प्रवेश परीक्षा (पी०जी०) की मेरिट के आधार पर ही प्रदान किया जायेगा।

विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं के लिए सेमेस्टर प्रणाली लागू है। सेमेस्टर प्रणाली में निम्न बिन्दु प्रमुख हैं :

- स्नातकोत्तर डिग्री चार सेमेस्टर में प्राप्त की जा सकेगी। प्रत्येक शैक्षिक सत्र में दो सेमेस्टर होंगे।
- सेमेस्टर प्रणाली में छात्र की उपस्थिति का विवरण क्रमशः विभागाध्यक्ष एवं प्राचार्य से अग्रसारित कर विश्वविद्यालय में जमा करना अनिवार्य है। केवल 75% उपस्थिति वाले छात्रों को ही संबंधित सेमेस्टर परीक्षा में बैठने की अनुमति होगी।
- स्नातकोत्तर सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक छात्र के दो आंतरिक आंकलन (Internal Assessment) (20+20 अंक प्रति कोर्स) होंगे। आंतरिक आंकलन विभागाध्यक्ष द्वारा निर्धारित तिथियों पर होगा तथा इनमें प्राप्त प्राप्तांक सेमेस्टर परीक्षाफल में जोड़े जायेंगे। विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा 60 अंक प्रति कोर्स होगा। विस्तृत विवरण पृष्ठ 47-52 पर वर्णित है।

(क) एम0ए0 प्रथम सेमेस्टर के लिए वि.वि. द्वारा निर्धारित नियम लागू होंगे।

एम0ए0 प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश के लिये (भूगोल विषय को छोड़कर) आवेदन हेतु अर्हकारी परीक्षा (बी0ए0/समकक्ष) में कम से कम 40% अंक प्राप्त करना अनिवार्य है। एम०ए० (भूगोल) में प्रवेश हेतु सामान्य/OBC/EWS हेतु न्यूनतम 45% तथा SC/ST हेतु 40% अंक होना अनिवार्य है। प्रायोगिक विषयों भूगोल, मनोविज्ञान व चित्रकला में प्रवेश हेतु, स्नातक स्तर पर इन विषयों का होना आवश्यक है। मनोविज्ञान विषय में प्रवेश हेतु विज्ञान विषय में स्नातक अथवा बी.एड. उत्तीर्ण विद्यार्थी भी अर्ह होंगे। एम.ए. अंग्रेजी हेतु भी अंग्रेजी विषय स्नातक स्तर पर होना आवश्यक है। ऑनलाइन प्रवेश प्रक्रिया के अन्तर्गत Website में दिये गये नियमों के आधार पर एम0ए0 में प्रवेश के इच्छुक अभ्यर्थियों को UET मेरिट फार्म भरकर निर्धारित तिथि तक संलग्नकों सहित ऑनलाइन फार्म जमा करना होगा। निर्धारित सीटों पर मेरिट में स्थान पाने वाले अभ्यर्थी ही प्रवेश आवेदन पत्र के आधार पर प्रवेश समिति के सम्मुख आवश्यकतानुसार प्रमाण पत्र आदि प्रस्तुत करके प्रवेश प्राप्त कर सकेंगे।

(ख) एम0एस-सी0 प्रथम सेमेस्टर प्रवेश के लिए वि.वि. द्वारा निर्धारित नियम लागू होंगे।

- एम0एस-सी0, प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश हेतु न्यूनतम अर्हता इस विश्वविद्यालय अथवा विधि मान्य किसी अन्य विश्वविद्यालय की त्रिवर्षीय बी0एस-सी0 परीक्षा कम से कम 45 % अंकों से उत्तीर्ण होनी चाहिये। अनुसूचित जाति तथा अनुसूचित जनजाति हेतु 40% तथा इसके अतिरिक्त प्रवेश विश्वविद्यालय प्रवेश परीक्षा (UET) की मेरिट के आधार पर किये जायेंगे, जिसके लिए निर्धारित मेरिट फार्म भरकर निर्धारित संलग्नकों सहित संबंधित कार्यालयों/ ऑनलाइन रूप में अंतिम तिथि से पूर्व जमा करना होगा। मेरिट में स्थान



आने पर प्रवेश आवेदन पत्र में माँगे गये संलग्नक प्रस्तुत करने पर ही प्रवेश प्रदान किया जायेगा।

- (ii) प्रत्याशी केवल उसी विषय में प्रवेश ले सकते हैं, जो उन्होंने बी०एस-सी० स्तर पर मुख्य विषय के रूप में लिया है।
- (ग) एम०कॉम० प्रथम सेमेस्टर प्रवेश के लिए वि.वि. द्वारा निर्धारित नियम लागू होंगे।
- (i) बी०कॉम० अथवा समकक्ष परीक्षा वाणिज्य विषय के साथ न्यूनतम 40% के साथ उत्तीर्ण की हो। इसके अतिरिक्त प्रवेश मेरिट के आधार पर किये जायेंगे जिसके लिए मेरिट फार्म भरकर स्वप्रमाणित वांछित संलग्नकों सहित संबंधित विभाग/ऑनलाइन रूप में अंतिम तिथि से पूर्व जमा करना होगा। मेरिट सूची में स्थान आने पर प्रवेश आवेदन पत्र में माँगे गये मूल प्रमाण पत्र प्रस्तुत करने पर ही प्रवेश प्रदान किया जायेगा।
- (ii) कला तथा विज्ञान वर्ग में अभ्यर्थियों को स्नातक स्तर पर 50% अंकों व गणित/अर्थशास्त्र के साथ उत्तीर्ण होना अनिवार्य होगा।

6. शिक्षक प्रशिक्षण में स्नातक (बी०एड०) कक्षा में प्रवेश हेतु नियम

बी०एड० कक्षा में प्रवेश विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा आयोजित प्रवेश (UET) परीक्षा की मेरिट के आधार पर किया जाता है। अनिवार्य अर्हता विश्वविद्यालय नियमों के अनुरूप होगी जिसकी विस्तृत सूचना बी०एड० विभाग से प्राप्त की जा सकती है।

7. विधि स्नातक (एल-एल०बी०) कक्षाओं के प्रवेश हेतु

विधि स्नातक की उपाधि का व्यावसायिक पाठ्यक्रम 3 वर्ष का है। इसे 6 सेमेस्टर्स में विभाजित किया गया है। पाठ्यक्रम 'बार काउंसिल ऑफ इण्डिया' के नवीनतम निर्देशों के अनुसार तैयार किया गया है। इसमें चार प्रश्न-पत्र प्रायोगिक भी हैं। प्रवेश के इच्छुक अभ्यर्थी ध्यान दें कि प्रायोगिक विषयों की तैयारी के लिए उन्हें दिन में न्यायालय में जाना पड़ता है।

- (1) विधि प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित नियमों तथा (CUET-General Aptitude test) मेरिट के आधार पर होगा।
- (2) विधि की कक्षाएं दिन में होती हैं। अतः सेवारत अभ्यर्थियों को अपने विभाग से अनापत्ति प्रमाण-पत्र प्रस्तुत करना अनिवार्य है और अध्ययन के दिनों का अवकाश लेने पर ही वे प्रवेश के लिए अर्ह होंगे।
- (3) प्रवेश के लिए सामान्य वर्ग व अन्य पिछड़ा वर्ग के अभ्यर्थियों के लिए स्नातक स्तर की परीक्षा में क्रमशः न्यूनतम 45 % एवं 42 % अंक होना अनिवार्य हैं। अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति के अभ्यर्थियों के लिए न्यूनतम 40% अंक अनिवार्य हैं।
- (4) छः सेमेस्टर विधि स्नातक के नये पाठ्यक्रम के अभ्यर्थी छात्र/ छात्राओं को विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित अधिकतम समय सीमा में उपाधि प्राप्त करनी होगी।
- (5) एल-एल०बी० कक्षाओं के पाठ्यक्रमों में प्रवेश से सम्बन्धित नियमावली में 'बार काउंसिल ऑफ इण्डिया' के अनुसार

कभी भी परिवर्तन किया जा सकता है।

- (6) शासनादेश संख्या 528 (11 15-30 शि.) 71/97 दिनांक 11 जून 1997 के अनुसार कोई भी छात्र एलएल०बी० की परीक्षा में सम्मिलित होने की अनुमति तब तक प्राप्त नहीं कर सकेगा, जब तक कि वह 75% उपस्थिति पूरी नहीं करता। संकाय अध्यक्ष/प्राचार्य/कुलपति महोदय द्वारा विशेष परिस्थितियों में दी गई छूट के बाद भी बार काउंसिल ऑफ इंडिया के नियमों के अनुसार किसी भी छात्र की 66% से कम उपस्थिति नहीं होनी चाहिए।
- (7) विश्वविद्यालय के द्वारा जो छात्र/छात्रायें महाविद्यालय में विधि प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश लेंगे उनका प्रवेश किसी अन्य महाविद्यालय में स्थानान्तरित नहीं होगा। उन्हें इसी महाविद्यालय से विधि की उपाधि प्राप्त करना अनिवार्य होगा।
- (8) विधि तृतीय एवं पंचम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित नये नियमों के अनुसार दिया जायेगा।
- (9) विस्तृत सूचना विधि विभाग से प्राप्त की जा सकती है।

8. स्ववित्त पोषित पाठ्यक्रम

स्ववित्त पोषित पाठ्यक्रमों पी०जी०डी०जे०एम०सी०,बी.एससी. (आई०टी०), एम०ए० (मास कम्युनिकेशन) में प्रवेश हेतु अर्ह कक्षा में न्यूनतम 40% अंक अनिवार्य है। प्रवेश विश्वविद्यालय नियमानुसार (CUET/UET) मेरिट आधारित होंगे। शुल्क व प्रवेश प्रक्रिया व अन्य जानकारी हेतु सम्बन्धित विभाग में सम्पर्क करें। इस विभाग द्वारा त्रैमासिक 'डी.ए.वी.' न्यूज लैटर नियमित प्रकाशित किया जाता है।

9. मेरिट आधारित प्रवेश (ऑनलाइन प्रक्रिया द्वारा)

पहले छात्रों को नियमानुसार मेरिट फार्म भरकर जमा करना होगा। मेरिट में स्थान पाने पर ही प्रवेश दिया जायेगा।

स्नातकोत्तर स्तर पर ऐसे आवेदन फार्म निरस्त कर दिये जायेंगे जिसमें UET/ प्रवेश पत्र व परिणाम (अंक सूची), स्नातक स्तर के समस्त सेमेस्टर/वर्षों की अंक तालिकाओं के लिखित तथा प्रायोगिक/मौखिक पूर्णांक तथा प्राप्तांक अलग-अलग नहीं दर्शाए गए होंगे। मेरिट द्वारा प्रवेश हेतु एक प्रवेश समिति होगी जो निर्धारित अन्तिम तिथि तक प्राप्त मेरिट व प्रवेश आवेदन-पत्रों के आधार पर लिस्ट तैयार करायेगी। UET आधारित मेरिट लिस्ट तथा वेटिंग लिस्ट निर्धारित तिथि तक नोटिस बोर्ड एवं वेबसाइट पर लगा दी जायेगी। प्रत्याशी इस लिस्ट को देखना स्वयं सुनिश्चित करेंगे। प्रत्याशियों को लिस्ट में निर्दिष्ट तिथि, समय व स्थान पर साक्षात्कार हेतु उपस्थित होना अनिवार्य होगा, जिसमें उनकी प्रमाण पत्रों आदि का सत्यापन तथा विषय में उनकी अभिरुचि का आकलन किया जायेगा। प्रवेश समिति को अधिकार होगा कि विशेष परिस्थितियों में मेरिट में नाम होने के बाद भी प्रवेश देने से इन्कार कर दे। साक्षात्कार के समय सभी अभिलेखों की मूल प्रति दिखाना अनिवार्य होगा।

अपने आवेदन-पत्र के साथ UET (PG) प्रवेश पत्र व रिजल्ट कार्ड, अर्ह परीक्षा की अंक-तालिकाओं की स्वसत्यापित प्रतिलिपि अवश्य संलग्न करें।

नहीं लगे हैं, निरस्त कर दिये जायेंगे।

मेरिट तैयार करने में पूरी सावधानी बरती जाती है, किन्तु फिर भी यदि कोई त्रुटि किसी समय भी ज्ञात होती है तो उसे दूर किया जायेगा, चाहे इससे किसी प्रत्याशी की मेरिट पर कोई भी प्रभाव पड़ता हो। त्रुटिवश मेरिट सूची में आया कोई नाम प्रवेश का हकदार नहीं होगा। उसे किसी भी स्तर पर निरस्त करने का पूर्ण अधिकार प्रवेश समिति को होगा।

यदि 'मेन लिस्ट' के प्रत्याशियों के प्रवेश के बाद रिक्त रहते हैं तो 'वेटिंग लिस्ट' के प्रत्याशियों को अवसर दिया जायेगा। वेटिंग लिस्ट एक से अधिक भी हो सकती है जो सीटें रिक्त होने पर क्रमशः घोषित की जायेगी।

सभी संकायों की स्नातक एवं स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं में प्रवेश हेतु सूची में नाम आने पर यदि निर्धारित तिथि तक छात्र प्रवेश नहीं लेता है तो उसका दावा समाप्त हो जाएगा। विस्तृत जानकारी के लिए सम्बन्धित विभागाध्यक्षों से सम्पर्क किया जा सकता है।

Note: As per the decision of the university 5% campus weightage will be granted in P.G. programmes to the students who have passed their UG examination from the campuses or the affiliated colleges of HNBGU.

(ख) प्रत्येक कक्षा के प्रथम सेमेस्टर में प्रवेश हेतु अनुसूचित जाति/जनजाति के अभ्यर्थियों के लिए न्यूनतम अर्हता अंकों में अधिकतम 5 अंकों की छूट दी जायेगी। बशर्ते विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा किसी कक्षा हेतु न्यूनतम अंक निर्धारित न किये हों। EWS श्रेणी का 10% आरक्षण उत्तराखण्ड सरकार तथा विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रत्येक कक्षा में सीटें बढ़ाने पर ही अनुमन्य होगा। आरक्षित श्रेणी के अभ्यर्थियों को प्रवेश में आरक्षण का लाभ महाविद्यालय द्वारा तभी दिया जायेगा जबकि उनका संबंधित श्रेणी का आरक्षण प्रमाण पत्र उत्तराखण्ड के किसी जनपद के सक्षम अधिकारी द्वारा निर्गत किया गया हो। किसी अन्य राज्य के सक्षम अधिकारी द्वारा निर्गत आरक्षण प्रमाण पत्र प्रवेश में आरक्षण का लाभ देने हेतु मान्य नहीं होगा।

ऐसे समस्त छात्रों को जो हे0न0ब0 गढ़वाल विश्वविद्यालय श्रीनगर में नामांकित (एनरोल्ड) नहीं हैं, अपना नामांकन (एनरोलमेंट) इस विश्वविद्यालय में कराना होगा। विश्वविद्यालय का नामांकन शुल्क तथा प्रवजन प्रमाण-पत्र (माईग्रेशन सर्टिफिकेट), जहाँ आवश्यक हो, को आवेदन पत्र प्राचार्य के माध्यम से कुलसचिव, हे0न0ब0 गढ़वाल विश्वविद्यालय को प्रेषित किया जायेगा। यह छात्र का उत्तरदायित्व है कि वह नामांकन आवेदन-पत्र भरे तथा मूल प्रवजन प्रमाण-पत्र, परीक्षा-आवेदन पत्र के साथ जमा करे।

13. उपस्थिति

कोई भी छात्र/छात्रा जिसकी विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा निर्धारित 75% से कम उपस्थिति है, विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा में बैठने हेतु अर्ह नहीं होगा। विशेष परिस्थिति में प्राचार्य की संस्तुति पर विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति इस प्रावधान में छूट दे सकते हैं। (विस्तृत विवरण पृष्ठ 53-54 पर है)

किसी भी प्रयोगात्मक विषय में लिखित और प्रायोगिक अलग-अलग पाठ्यक्रम माने जायेंगे और उनमें अलग-अलग उपस्थिति आवश्यक होगी। लिखित में



उपस्थिति का तात्पर्य व्याख्यान, ट्यूटोरियल और सेमिनार में उपस्थित रहने से है।

14. नियन्ता मण्डल

कॉलेज प्रांगण में छात्र/छात्राओं में अनुशासन एवं समुचित शैक्षिक वातावरण बनाये रखने हेतु एक वरिष्ठ प्राध्यापक के नेतृत्व में नियन्ता मण्डल का गठन किया जाता है। नियन्ता मण्डल में शिक्षक नियन्ताओं के साथ प्रीफेक्ट के रूप में छात्र/छात्राओं को भी सम्मिलित किया जा सकता है। परिचय पत्रों पर नियन्ता मण्डल के सदस्यों द्वारा ही हस्ताक्षर किये जायेंगे।

15. परिचय-पत्र

प्रवेश के समय सभी छात्रों को शुल्क रसीद के साथ परिचय-पत्र जारी किया जाता है। निर्धारित तिथि तक इस परिचय-पत्र को स्वयं मुख्य नियन्ता से हस्ताक्षरित करा लेना अनिवार्य है। छात्र हर समय अपना परिचय-पत्र अपने पास रखें और जब भी कॉलेज अधिकारी उसे देखने की माँग करें, तुरंत दिखायें। यदि परिचय-पत्र खो जाये तो इसकी प्रथम सूचना (तहरीर) पास के पुलिस थाने या चौकी में अवश्य करानी होगी। दूसरा परिचय-पत्र (Duplicate I-Card) कॉलेज कार्यालय से पचास रुपये (50/-) शुल्क देकर प्राप्त किया जा सकता है। इस हेतु आवेदन प्रथम सूचना रिपोर्ट (F.I.R.) की प्रमाणित प्रतिलिपि फोटोग्राफ व वेबसाइट पर उपलब्ध आवेदन पत्र के साथ मुख्य नियन्ता कार्यालय में प्रस्तुत करें। इस विषय में मुख्य नियन्ता का निर्णय ही अन्तिम होगा। छात्र/छात्रायें अपने बने हुए परिचय-पत्र मुख्य कार्यालय से व्यक्तिगत रूप से उपस्थित होकर प्राप्त करें। अन्य किसी का परिचय पत्र कोई छात्र प्राप्त नहीं कर पायेगा।

16. छात्रवृत्तियाँ एवं शुल्क विमुक्ति

कॉलेज में सभी प्रकार की शासकीय छात्रवृत्ति प्राप्य है। उच्च शैक्षिक योग्यताधारी निर्धन छात्रों को सरकार द्वारा निर्धारित कोटा के अन्तर्गत पूर्ण और अर्ध शुल्क-विमुक्ति प्रदान की जाती है। पिछले सत्र में दी गई शुल्क-विमुक्ति का स्वयमेव सततीकरण नहीं होगा और न ही कोई छात्र इस आधार पर स्वतः प्राप्त करने का अधिकारी होगा। शुल्क विमुक्ति एवं छात्रवृत्ति अनुशासन भंग करने, परीक्षा में अनुत्तीर्ण होने, अध्ययन में असंतोषजनक प्रगति अथवा परीक्षा में अनुचित साधन प्रयोग की दशा में निलम्बित की जा सकती है। छात्रवृत्तियों के सम्बन्ध में इच्छुक छात्र/छात्रा डीन छात्र कल्याण से सम्पर्क स्थापित करके INSPIRE तथा अन्य विभागों द्वारा दी जाने वाली छात्रवृत्तियों के बारे में जानकारी ले सकते हैं।

1. **डॉ० दिनेश प्रताप स्मृति पुरस्कार एवं छात्रवृत्ति (सौजन्य : डॉ. आराधना दिनेश प्रताप)** के अन्तर्गत एम. ए. प्रथम वर्ष भूगोल (सेमेस्टर प्रथम एवं द्वितीय संयुक्त योग) में अधिकतम अंक प्राप्त करने वाले विद्यार्थी को रु. 10000 का पुरस्कार एवं प्रमाण पत्र से सम्मानित किया जायेगा जोकि रेखांकित चैक के माध्यम से आगामी 26 जनवरी (गणतंत्र

दिवस) को प्रदान किया जाता है।

2. **विश्वविद्यालय की परीक्षा में प्रथम स्थान (स्वर्ण पदक) प्राप्त करने वाले महाविद्यालय के छात्र/छात्रा को दिया जाने वाला स्व. जगेन्द्र स्वरूप स्मृति वार्षिक नकद पुरस्कार रु 5100/- (सौजन्य प्रो. के.आर. जैन) :** यह पुरस्कार महाविद्यालय के उस संस्थागत (स्ववित्त पोषित पाठ्यक्रमों को छोड़कर) छात्र/छात्रा को दिया जाता है जोकि हे.ने.ब. गढ़वाल के केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय श्रीनगर (गढ़वाल) द्वारा आयोजित किसी भी नियमित कक्षा तथा विषय में विश्वविद्यालय में प्रथम स्थान प्राप्त कर स्वर्ण पदक प्राप्त करता है। यह रु. 5100 का नकद पुरस्कार प्रतिवर्ष 26 जनवरी के कार्यक्रम में महाविद्यालय में प्रदान किया जाता है। यह पुरस्कार शैक्षिक वर्ष 2022-23 से प्रारम्भ हुआ है।
3. **स्व. सरदार जीत सिंह बिन्दा स्मृति वार्षिक क्रीडा पुरस्कार (सौजन्य डॉ. जसविन्दर सिंह) :** यह पुरस्कार उस सर्वश्रेष्ठ खिलाड़ी को दिया जाता है जो कि महाविद्यालय की उस वर्ष की समस्त क्रीडा प्रतियोगिताओं में से सर्वोत्तम खिलाड़ी के रूप में चयनित होता है। इसके लिए उस खिलाड़ी को रु. 3100 की धनराशि पुरस्कार के रूप में प्रदान की जाती है।
4. **स्व. स. देवेन्द्र सिंह सेठी स्मृति वार्षिक NCC (छात्र) पुरस्कार (सौजन्य डॉ. जसविन्दर सिंह) :** यह पुरस्कार उस सर्वश्रेष्ठ एनसीसी छात्र को दिया जाता है जो उस वर्ष की समस्त एनसीसी गतिविधियों व क्रियाकलापों में सर्वोत्तम कैडेट के रूप में चयनित होता है। इसके लिए उस कैडेट को रु 2100 की धनराशि पुरस्कार के रूप में प्रदान की जाती है।
5. **स्व. सरदारनी सुरजीत कौर स्मृति वार्षिक NCC (छात्रा) पुरस्कार (सौजन्य डॉ. जसविन्दर सिंह) :** यह पुरस्कार उस सर्वश्रेष्ठ एनसीसी छात्रा को दिया जाता है जो उस वर्ष की समस्त एनसीसी गतिविधियों व कार्यक्रमों में सर्वोत्तम कैडेट के रूप में चयनित होती है। इसके लिए उस कैडेट को रु. 2100 की धनराशि पुरस्कार के रूप में प्रदान की जाती है।

17. चिकित्सकीय सुविधाएँ

महाविद्यालय में नियमित छात्र-छात्राओं हेतु प्राथमिक चिकित्सा उपलब्ध है जिसे महाविद्यालय समयावधि में प्रशिक्षित चिकित्सीय सहायक को दिखा कर, छात्र-छात्राओं द्वारा दवा इत्यादि प्राप्त की जा सकती है।

18. अनुसूचित जाति एवं अनुसूचित जनजाति के छात्र/छात्राओं हेतु शुल्क विमुक्ति व छात्रवृत्तियाँ

- (i) अनुसूचित जाति एवं जनजाति के जो छात्र/छात्रायें उत्तराखण्ड राज्य के मूल निवासी हैं, केवल उन्हें ही शुल्क विमुक्ति का लाभ प्राप्त हो सकेगा।
- (ii) अन्य नियम सम्बंधित फार्म पर दिए गए हैं। जिसमें ऑनलाइन जाति प्रमाण पत्र व आय प्रमाण पत्र प्रस्तुत करना आवश्यक है। छात्रवृत्तियाँ समाज कल्याण विभाग द्वारा स्वीकृत की जाती हैं।



19. पुस्तकालय एवं वाचनालय

कॉलेज में पूर्ण रूपेण सज्जित पुस्तकालय है, जिसमें दो लाख से अधिक पुस्तकें तथा विभिन्न विषयों के अनेक स्तरीय शोध ग्रन्थ उपलब्ध हैं। पुस्तकालय में एक सन्दर्भ कक्ष की भी व्यवस्था है जहाँ उच्च स्तरीय ग्रन्थ अध्ययन हेतु उपलब्ध हैं। विभिन्न स्नातकोत्तर कक्षाओं के लिए सम्बन्धित विभागों में विभागीय पुस्तकालयों की अलग से व्यवस्था है। एक बड़ा वाचनालय भी है। इसमें दैनिक समाचार पत्र, साप्ताहिक, पाक्षिक व मासिक पत्र-पत्रिकाएँ उपलब्ध रहती हैं।

20. प्रयोगशालाएँ

प्राणि विज्ञान, भौतिकी, रसायन विज्ञान, वनस्पति विज्ञान, सांख्यिकी, भूगोल, चित्रकला, शिक्षाशास्त्र, मनोविज्ञान, संगीत विभागों में पूर्ण सज्जित प्रयोगशालाएँ हैं, जहाँ प्रायोगिक अभ्यास करने के लिए पर्याप्त स्थान और सुविधाएँ हैं।

21. शोध कार्य

कॉलेज के स्नातकोत्तर विभागों में शोध सुविधाएँ उपलब्ध हैं। साथ ही विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग, डीएसटी, यूकॉस्ट व अन्य संस्थाओं के सहयोग से चलने वाली शोध परियोजनाओं के लिए भी महाविद्यालय में व्यवस्थाएँ हैं। पीएच-डी के लिए भी महाविद्यालय में पर्याप्त सुविधाएँ उपलब्ध हैं और विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के नियमों के अन्तर्गत शोध कराये जाते हैं। शोध छात्र/छात्राओं का आवंटन विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रवेश परीक्षा के आधार पर किया जाता है।

- (1) कॉलेज में शोध छात्रों को चयन के बाद अपना पंजीकरण कराना होता है जिसका शुल्क वर्तमान में रु0 6000/- है। शोध छात्रों की स्थिति विश्वविद्यालय के नियमों के अनुसार होगी।

22. कॉलेज की सदस्यता

कॉलेज में छात्रों के प्रवेश तब तक अनन्तिम (प्रोविजनल) माने जायेंगे जब तक वे प्राचार्य द्वारा अनुमोदित नहीं कर दिये जाते हैं। सभी छात्र कॉलेज के सदस्य तब माने जायेंगे, जब उनका प्रवेश आवेदन प्राचार्य द्वारा स्वीकार कर लिया जाये और उन्होंने कॉलेज की सम्पूर्ण शुल्क राशि तथा वांछित आवश्यक पत्रजात जमा कर दिए हों। किसी भी छात्र द्वारा कॉलेज शुल्क जमा कर देना मात्र उसका कॉलेज में प्रवेश का दावा स्थापित नहीं कर देता।

यदि किसी छात्र/छात्रा का पिछले शैक्षिक सत्र में चाल-चलन संतोषजनक न रहा हो, या वह परीक्षा में अनुचित साधन प्रयोग अथवा अभद्र व्यवहार का दोषी हो अथवा किसी ऐसी बीमारी से पीड़ित हो, जिसका सम्पर्क अन्य छात्र/छात्राओं के स्वास्थ्य के लिए हानिकारक हो, ऐसे प्रवेशार्थी को पुनः प्रवेश नहीं दिया जायेगा। यदि कोई छात्र/छात्रा कॉलेज की कोई सम्पत्ति, एन0सी0सी0 वर्दी, प्रयोगशाला उपकरण या कोई अन्य समान आदि वापस नहीं करता अथवा उसके द्वारा खोये किसी समान की पूर्ति अथवा उसके मूल्य का भुगतान नहीं करता, तो कॉलेज प्राचार्य को यह

अधिकार होगा कि वह ऐसे छात्र को विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा में बैठने से वंचित करने की संस्तुति विश्वविद्यालय को करे।

23. छात्रसंघ

छात्रसंघ, महाविद्यालय के विद्यार्थियों का प्रतिनिधि निकाय है जिसका गठन प्रतिवर्ष छात्रसंघ के संविधान एवं इस सम्बन्ध में विश्वविद्यालय तथा लिंगदोह समिति द्वारा दी गई संस्तुतियों के क्रम में माननीय उच्चतम न्यायालय द्वारा पारित आदेशानुसार किया जाता है। वर्तमान में छात्रसंघ गठन सम्बन्धी प्रमुख नियम निम्न प्रकार हैं:-

- (1) प्रत्येक वर्ष सत्र प्रारम्भ होने की तिथि से 6 से 8 सप्ताह के अन्तर्गत संस्था स्तर पर छात्रसंघ चुनाव कराना आवश्यक होगा। छात्रसंघ कार्यकारिणी में पदाधिकारियों सहित 11 सदस्य होंगे। नामांकन से लेकर प्रचार तथा परिणाम घोषित होने तक सम्पूर्ण प्रक्रिया 10 दिन के अन्दर सम्पन्न कराई जायेगी। छात्रसंघ चुनाव में स्नातक विद्यार्थियों की आयु सीमा 17 से 22 वर्ष तथा स्नातकोत्तर विद्यार्थियों के लिए आयु सीमा अधिकतम 25 वर्ष है। कोई भी प्रत्याशी पदाधिकारी पद हेतु एक बार तथा कार्यकारिणी पद हेतु दो बार चुनाव लड़ सकेगा। निर्वाचित पदाधिकारियों का शपथ ग्रहण (पद-ग्रहण) चुनाव परिणाम घोषित होने के एक सप्ताह के भीतर कराया जाना अनिवार्य होगा। आपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि अथवा संस्था के अनुशासन को भंग करने पर दण्डित किया गया/गई छात्र/छात्रा छात्रसंघ चुनाव लड़ने हेतु अनर्ह होगा/होगी। नामांकन प्रपत्र में प्रत्याशी को वही नाम लिखना होगा जो उसके हाईस्कूल प्रमाण-पत्र में है। चुनाव सम्बन्धी अद्यतन आचार संहिता चुनाव घोषित होने के समय उपलब्ध करायी जायेगी।
- (2) चुनाव आचार संहिता, निर्धारित नियम एवं व्यवस्थाएँ लिंगदोह समिति/माननीय उच्चतम न्यायालय के आदेशानुसार होगी जिनको विस्तार से विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग की वेबसाइट (www.ugc.ac.in) पर देखा जा सकता है। छात्रसंघ आचार संहिता एवं नियमावली का उल्लंघन करने वाले छात्र प्रतिनिधियों को पदच्युत भी किया जा सकता है।
- (3) महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य छात्रसंघ के पदेन संरक्षक हैं तथा किसी भी विवाद में उनका निर्णय सर्वमान्य व अन्तिम होगा।

24. क्रीड़ा सुविधाएँ

महाविद्यालय में एक क्रीड़ा परिषद् है जिसमें महाविद्यालय के छात्र-छात्राओं हेतु विभिन्न खेलों यथा फुटबॉल, वालीबॉल, क्रिकेट, हॉकी, टेबिल-टेनिस, बास्केटबॉल, बैडमिन्टन, कबड्डी, वेट लिफ्टिंग, बॉडी-बिल्डिंग आदि की पर्याप्त सुविधाएँ उपलब्ध हैं। इन में छात्र-छात्राएँ भाग ले सकते हैं। विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा आयोजित अन्तर महाविद्यालय प्रतियोगिताओं में खिलाड़ियों के चयन की प्रक्रिया अगस्त माह में प्रारम्भ होती है। उपरोक्त खेलों में भाग लेने के इच्छुक छात्र-छात्राएँ क्रीड़ा कार्यालय में क्रीड़ा सचिव/खेल प्रबन्धक से सम्पर्क कर सायं 5 से 7 बजे तक अपना रजिस्ट्रेशन करवा सकते हैं।

25. राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना (एन0एस0एस0)



राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना (NSS) की एक इकाई में 100 छात्र/छात्राएँ (स्वयंसेवी) होते हैं तथा प्रत्येक इकाई का एक कार्यक्रम अधिकारी (महाविद्यालय का शिक्षक/शिक्षिका) होता है, जो कि अपनी इकाई की गतिविधियों का संचालन करता है। राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना में छात्र/छात्रा को लगातार दो वर्ष पंजीकृत रहना आवश्यक है। राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना के अंतर्गत मुख्य रूप में दो प्रकार के कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया जाता है—

- (1) नियमित कार्यक्रम (प्रत्येक वर्ष 120 घंटे, दोनों वर्षों में कुल 240 घण्टे)
 - (2) सात दिवसीय रात दिन का विशेष शिविर कार्यक्रम
- सम्प्रति महाविद्यालय में राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना की कुल 06 (छः) इकाइयाँ हेमवती नन्दन बहुगुणा गढ़वाल विश्वविद्यालय, श्रीनगर द्वारा आवंटित हैं, जिसके अंतर्गत 400 स्वयंसेवियों का नामांकन किया जायेगा।

(A) पात्रता 'बी' प्रमाण पत्र

पात्रता 'बी' प्रमाण पत्र प्रथम वर्ष हेतु नामांकित स्वयंसेवी जिन्होंने नियमित कार्यक्रम के अंतर्गत 120 घंटे पूर्ण कर लिये हो। अथवा स्वयंसेवी जो द्वितीय वर्ष हेतु नामांकित हो तथा प्रथम वर्ष में बी परीक्षा में अनुत्तीर्ण हुआ हो (केवल 01 वर्ष अनुत्तीर्ण को अवसर मिलेगा।)

(B) पात्रता 'सी' प्रमाण पत्र

पात्रता 'सी' प्रमाण पत्र हेतु स्वयंसेवी जो 02 वर्ष तक राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना में लगातार नामांकित होकर नियमित शिविर के अंतर्गत प्रत्येक वर्ष 120 घंटे कार्य किया हो तथा 01 सात दिवसीय विशेष दिन-रात के शिविर को पूर्ण करके 'बी' प्रमाण पत्र परीक्षा उत्तीर्ण कर ली हो।

26. राष्ट्रीय कैंडिड कोर (एन0सी0सी0)

स्नातक स्तरीय छात्र/छात्राओं के लिए एन0सी0सी0 की अलग-अलग सुविधा उपलब्ध है। इन्हें एन0सी0सी0 अधिकारियों की देख-रेख में संचालित किया जाता है। इसमें चयन हेतु एक शारीरिक क्षमता परीक्षा होती है। एन0सी0सी0 में प्रति सप्ताह में चार घंटे परेड की ट्रेनिंग होती है तथा उसमें 75% उपस्थिति अनिवार्य है। उपस्थिति में छूट केवल कुछ विशेष परिस्थितियों में प्राचार्य द्वारा दी जा सकती है। जो कैंडिड कॉलेज या विश्वविद्यालयों या केन्द्र और राज्य सरकारों द्वारा आयोजित युवक समारोहों में प्रतिनिधित्व करने जायेंगे अथवा पर्वतारोहण संस्थानों द्वारा सम्पादित पर्वतारोहण पाठ्यक्रमों में भाग लेने जायेंगे, उन्हें इस दौरान परेड में उपस्थित माना जायेगा। एन0सी0सी0 कैंडेटों द्वारा गत वर्षों में अपनी विशिष्ट उपलब्धियों द्वारा महाविद्यालय को सम्पूर्ण राष्ट्र में गौरवान्वित किया है।

नोट: विद्यार्थी एन0सी0सी0 तथा एन0एस0एस0 में से केवल एक ही चुन सकता है।

27. रोवर रेन्जर

महाविद्यालय में छात्र और छात्राओं के लिए रोवर व रेन्जर इकाईयाँ भी गठित हैं जिसमें इच्छुक अभ्यर्थी भाग लेकर राष्ट्र सेवा कर सकते हैं।

28. सांस्कृतिक समिति

महाविद्यालय में सांस्कृतिक गतिविधियों को प्रोत्साहित करने के लिए एक सांस्कृतिक समिति भी गठित है जिसमें इच्छुक अभ्यर्थी भाग लेकर अपनी क्षमताओं को प्रदर्शित कर सकते हैं।

29. कॉलेज पत्रिका 'जिज्ञासा'

छात्रा-छात्राओं में सृजनात्मक अभिरुचि उत्पन्न करने के ध्येय से कॉलेज प्रतिवर्ष 'जिज्ञासा' नामक पत्रिका प्रकाशित करता है। इसमें छात्रों, शिक्षकों एवं शिक्षणेत्तर कर्मचारियों की रचनाओं के अतिरिक्त कॉलेज की विभिन्न गतिविधियों की रिपोर्ट प्रकाशित की जाती है।

30. इन्दिरा गाँधी राष्ट्रीय मुक्त विश्वविद्यालय (IGNOU) अध्ययन केन्द्र

महाविद्यालय में इंदिरा गाँधी राष्ट्रीय मुक्त विश्वविद्यालय के अध्ययन केन्द्र (2705) में स्नातकोत्तर प्रबंधन, पुस्तकालय विज्ञान, सामाजिक कार्य, पत्रकारिता विज्ञान, पर्यटन प्रबंधन, वाणिज्य, अंग्रेजी, लोक प्रशासन, इतिहास, राजनीति विज्ञान, हिन्दी, समाजशास्त्र आदि विषयों में तथा विज्ञान, कला, वाणिज्य तथा पर्यटन प्रबंधन में स्नातक तथा विभिन्न रोजगारोन्मुख डिप्लोमा व सर्टिफिकेट कोर्स उपलब्ध हैं। विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा ऑडियो/विजुअल अध्ययन सामग्री के साथ श्रेष्ठ पुस्तकें भी उपलब्ध करायी जाती हैं। महाविद्यालय के छात्र/छात्रा अपनी कौशल वृद्धि हेतु सर्टिफिकेट तथा डिप्लोमा कोर्सेस साथ-साथ कर सकते हैं।

31. कैरियर काउंसिलिंग एवं प्लेसमेंट सेवा

33. Best Practice of the college- Mantrana Debating Society and its activities

'Mantrana Debating Society' of DAV(PG) College was formed in the college under the guidance of Dr Onima Sharma, Coordinator IQAC, who believed that the more one fears speaking, the less probability of success one begets, so fear and success are mutually exclusive. It was this gusto and the passion to instill the qualities of public speaking, critical thinking and logical reasoning that catapulted the Society to the fame it has attained in the present time.

In its incipient years the Society has had a representation in International and National events. The annual VoWMantrana Pan India Debate is another diadem in its crown which is organised by the Valley of Word Literature and Arts festival. Mantrana has also organized educational tours of students at Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration, Indian Military Academy and Regional Science Centre Dehradun on various occasions. The members of Mantrana Society have also represented College at 'Global Youth Summit for Peace and Sustainable Development' as guest speakers, did field research work and survey for 'Lokniti', did volunteer-internship with UCOST among other accomplishments. Mantrana Society established Civil Services Forum on October, 25 2019 for fostering a healthy competition and providing guidance and study material for various government examinations i.e, UPSC, PCS, SSC, SSB, CDS, AFCAT and many more. Various online and offline lectures, group discussions and mock tests have been conducted under its aegis. 34. ICC-आन्तरिक शिकायत समिति

The ICC upholds the dignity and rights of all individuals, reinforcing the institution's commitment to a safe and supportive educational environment. Prof. Savita Rawat (contact No. - 9760975309) is the presiding Officer of ICC Cell.

35. The Code of Conduct for Students

The college desires that all students must abide by established rules to maintain discipline in the college and outside. They will daily participate in singing of National Anthem and National Song at the stipulated timings. All students must co-operate in maintaining cleanliness in college premises including the toilets. Any violation of rules and indiscipline will result in severe action against that student or group of students as per college rules.

Curbing Indiscipline and Misconduct by Students

The following acts on the part of students, individually or collectively, or in a group of two or more students or persons, shall amount to indiscipline and misconduct:

- Physical assault, threat to use physical force, or any other intimidating behavior, within the premises of the institution or of any unit of any such institution, against any teacher, officer, functionary, member of any authority or unit, or other body, member of the non-teaching staff, or student of any such institution or unit, or a visitor present on official invitation or for administrative or academic work in such premises:
- Causing disruption or disturbance in any manner in the



- teaching and other academic work, the working of libraries, laboratories, facilities and amenities, admission and examination processes, administrative working, and in the institution or any unit of the institution.
3. The use of loudspeakers or any other sound amplification device in the premises of the institution except where the proctor or functionary responsible for the maintenance of discipline has permitted such use for any educational, academic, co-curricular, literary, cultural or other extracurricular event.
 4. Unruly and disorderly behavior during the course of any educational or academic excursion or tour, or at any event or competition relating to curricular, co-curricular or literary, cultural, sports or other extracurricular activities, or other social, educational or career-related programmes organized by, or in, any institution or more than one institution, of the university system, or any unit of such institution, whether within or outside the premises of any such institution or unit.
 5. Any disobedience of, or dissent against, the awards or decisions of Referees, Umpires, Judges, or other adjudicators, officiating at any event or competition.
 6. Any act or statement, or distribution or display of any document or literature, including the circulars, pamphlets, posters, press releases, etc., which adversely affects the public image of any institution of the University system, or of any unit thereof, or of any individual belonging to, or associated with, such institution or unit.
 7. The possession and distribution of objectionable goods or materials.
 8. Any act that creates, or tends to create, ill-will between groups of persons or promotes intolerance on religious, social, regional, or linguistic grounds.
 9. Any act violative of the provision of the statutes, the ordinances or the Regulations of the University, or of the rules made there under.
 10. The possession, display, use or threat of any weapon.
 11. Any act that interferes with the personal liberty of another person, or subjects other persons to indignity, or involves physical violence or use of abusive language. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976.
 12. Any violation of the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes.
 13. Any act or practice, whether verbal or otherwise, that is derogatory of women or amounts to sexual harassment.
 14. The making of false statements or the submission of false documents.
 15. The use of the title of the University, or of any institution of the University system, or of any unit of such institution, for any organization or event, or in any communication or representation, without entitlement to such use, or for purposes not specifically authorized by the concerned institution or unit.
 16. Any attempt at bribery or recourse to any corrupt practice,

in any manner.

17. Any act that causes any loss, destruction, or defacement of the property of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
18. Any act amounting to unauthorized presence in, or entry or trespass into specified premises and areas, and any unauthorized retention or premises, of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
19. Any act that causes, encourages, or implies the interference of outside persons, organization or authorities in the functioning of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
20. Unauthorized collection of funds.
21. Possession, distribution or consumption of alcoholic drinks, intoxicants, narcotic drugs, and other psychotropic substances, and presence in the premises of institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution after such consumption.
22. Any act involving moral turpitude
23. Any other act that is, in the opinion of the officers or functionaries of the university or any unit of the University system, unbecoming of a student.
24. Any act of resorting to or abetting ragging.
25. Students shall avoid using cell-phones in the Campus; while, listening to music and sharing visuals on cellphones or other electronic devices in the Campus is strictly prohibited.

(1) रैगिंग से सम्बन्धित अभिप्राय है:

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to any student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely effect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which some students will not in the ordinary course do or perform and which has the effect or causing or generating a sense of shame or so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or junior student. Any of the above acts committed by any student of the same or junior or senior class shall be deemed to be ragging.

- रैगिंग के शिकार अथवा शिकारों में उपरोक्त में से किसी अथवा सभी कृत्यों को करने का प्रयास
- रैगिंग की परिभाषा से जनित समस्त अपराध

(3) दण्ड: संस्था की रैगिंग निरोध के अभिमत में अपराध की स्थापित प्रकृति एवं गंभीरता के आधार पर संस्थागत स्तर पर रैगिंग के दोषी पाये गये व्यक्तियों को दिये दण्ड निम्न में कोई एक अथवा उसका समूह हो सकता है—

- प्रवेश निरस्त किया जाना
- कक्षा से निलम्बन
- छात्र तथा अन्य लाभ रोके रखना अथवा निरस्त करना
- किसी भी परीक्षा अथवा मूल्यांकन प्रक्रिया से वंचित करना
- परीक्षा परिणाम रोकना

- किसी भी क्षेत्रीय, राष्ट्रीय एवं अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय संस्था अथवा युवा महोत्सव संस्था का प्रतिनिधित्व करना
 - छात्रावास से निष्कासन
 - निरस्तीकरण
 - संस्था से एक से चार सेमेस्टर अवधि हेतु निष्कासन
 - संस्थान से निष्कासन एवं तदोपरान्त अन्य किसी संस्था में प्रवेश से वंचित किये जाना
 - रु. 25 हजार का जुर्माना
- जब रैगिंग का अपराध करने वाले व्यक्तियों को न पहचाना जाये तब सम्भावित रैगिंगकर्ताओं पर सामुदायिक दबाव बनाने हेतु संस्था सामूहिक दण्ड का प्रयोग करेगी।

HNBGU Curriculum and Credit Framework for FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUP) [FOR STUDENTS ENROLLED IN 2022-23, 2023-24 & 2024-25]

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) encompasses Four-Year Bachelor's degree programmes such as B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Following are the key components of the FYUP:

Descriptions related to the Key Components

(a) Credit

The number of credits assigned to a course reflects the minimum time commitment required by a student in the form of lectures, tutorials, and practical sessions. As per the standard academic structure:

- One credit is equivalent to one hour of classroom teaching per week, or
- Two hours of practical/tutorial work per week.

Each semester shall comprise a minimum of 20 credits. To successfully complete a semester, a student must earn the required credits by passing the prescribed examinations and fulfilling course requirements.

(b) Major Course

The Major discipline represents the principal area of academic specialization within a degree programme. The degree shall be conferred in this discipline. The Major consists of a well-defined set of courses aimed at building comprehensive knowledge and competence in the subject. It includes both Core Courses and Core Elective Courses. To earn a degree with a major, students must meet the minimum credit requirements specified for different program categories.

Core Course/Discipline Specific Core Course (Major): These are mandatory courses associated with the Major discipline that every student must complete. They provide foundational and advanced knowledge essential to the core subject.

Core Elective Course/Discipline Specific Elective Course (Major): These are optional/elective courses within the Major discipline, offered as a pool of subject-specific papers. Students are given the flexibility to select courses based on their academic interests or career goals, allowing for a degree of customization within the Major framework.

(c) Minor Course

A Minor discipline provides students with an opportunity to broaden their knowledge and skills beyond their major discipline. It includes additional courses, vocational courses, and other specialized subjects designed to complement the major. To earn a degree with a minor, students must meet the minimum credit requirements specified for different program categories.

(c.1) Additional courses (Minor): These courses are offered in addition to the core subject(s) selected by the student at the

time of enrollment in the Undergraduate (UG) programme. They aim to broaden the academic exposure and skillset of students beyond their primary discipline. Additional courses offered are of two types: An interdisciplinary (ID) course will be of 4 semesters (semester I-IV) and the multidisciplinary (MD) course will be of two semesters for each subject as selected by the student (semester I-II or semester III-IV).

ID (Minor)– Departments/subjects which provide Additional courses as Interdisciplinary courses will offer the student an opportunity to pursue the same subject as additional course from first to fourth semester. It means student selecting ID subject in first semester will have to pursue the same subject till IV semester of U.G. Program.

MD (Minor)– Subjects which opt for additional course as multidisciplinary courses will offer the student an option to study multidisciplinary course of one subject in one year (I & II semester) and that of other subject in another year (III & IV semester).

Note: Students shall have the option to continue pursuing additional courses (Interdisciplinary or Multidisciplinary) during the VII and VIII semesters of the FYUP.

(c.2) Vocational Course/Field study (Minor): Vocational courses are designed to equip students with industry-relevant skills through specialized training tailored to the needs of entrepreneurs, businesses, and industries. The objective is to ensure that graduates are employment-ready and possess the practical competencies demanded by the job market. In addition, field study provides students with hands-on experience and practical exposure to real-world settings related to their academic discipline, thereby bridging the gap between theoretical knowledge and professional practice.

(c.3) Other Minor: Apart from these, the Minor courses may also include a selection of courses from a specific discipline that meet the credit requirements for the minor.

(d) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are specifically designed to strengthen students' practical and applied skillsets, with the objective of enhancing employability and fostering subject-specific competencies. Under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP), students are offered two distinct categories of SEC:

(d.i) Core-Specific Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are directly aligned with the core discipline(s) chosen by the student under the FYUP. Corespecific SECs are offered during Semesters 1 to 4 of the undergraduate programme. In cases where a student has opted for two core disciplines, SECs will be distributed across the first two academic years -



one discipline in the first year and the other in the second year.

Example: If a student has selected Botany and Zoology as core disciplines, they will study SECs related to Botany in the first year and SECs related to Zoology in the second year.

(d.ii) Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses (AMSC):

These courses provide students with the opportunity to acquire skills beyond their core disciplines, promoting a multidisciplinary learning experience. The University will offer a curated set of AMSCs to enable students to explore and develop competencies in diverse fields, thereby broadening their academic and professional horizons.

(e) Value Addition Course (VAC)

These are the courses which are apart from any discipline related courses and aims to add value to the overall personality and development of an individual while focusing on areas such as life skills & personality development connecting, understanding and connecting with environment; Indian Knowledge System; Culture, traditional and moral values, etc. It is compulsory to study all these value-added courses as offered by the University in different semesters.

(f) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

These courses aim to enhance the different capabilities and abilities of the students which will help them grow in very field of life and will help in their holistic development. Indian, Modern Language, Communication skills and AMSC are the courses offered under the AEC. Language courses: Under the Indian and Modern Languages, the language courses are offered. The language courses are meant to help the student to learn new languages of his/her choices. Student will be provided a pool of languages from which student may opt to study one language in any one semester and the other language in another semester for 2 credits each (5th or 6th semester).

(g) Self and Social Development Course

University will offer two courses under SSD that are (1) Community Connect & Service (2) Extracurricular activities. Student will have the choice to complete anyone of the two coursework. The course objective is to promote student participation in Community service/extracurricular activities for their self-development along with increasing their participation and developing within them a responsibility towards self and social development.

(g.i) Community Connect & Service Coursework: This course is aimed to connect students with community with the objective of understanding their issues and delivering their valuable inputs for the welfare of society. Student will have to deliver service equivalent to 2 credits for completing the course. This mandatory service may be completed in any one or two semesters from I to VIII semester (I to VI semester in case of exit with Three years UG degree) or I to VIII semester in case of completion/exit with Four-Year UG Honours/

Honours with research) through any social activity organized under the banner of "Swachh Bharat", "Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat", "NSS", "NCC", "Namami Gange" or social activities organised by the Campus or Departments. Student will have to produce a certificate in this regard from the organizers of the event(s).

(g.ii) Extracurricular Activities Coursework: This course work required student participation in university demarcated activities such as Participation/representation of institution in **Intercollegiate level activities/State level activities/National level activities (Sports/Cultural etc.)**.

(h) Short Term Skill course (STSC)

The university will also offer **Short Term Skill Course (STSC)**, which will be open to the local community, dropouts, college education candidates not having college education and other aspirants who can do them fulfilling minimum eligibility required for the course for admitting in the course. These courses will be of short duration for target groups and will not be for students undergoing four-year U.G. program.

Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit under FYUP

In accordance with the Multiple Entry and Exit provisions outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, students will be offered flexible exit and re-entry options aligned with the corresponding National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) levels and their respective academic requirements.

First Year (Under Graduate Certificate -NHEQF level-4.5)

- Under Graduate Certificate for those who exit the FYUP after successfully completing 1 year (2 semesters-I & II) by securing minimum 40 credits.
- Further, in addition, they have to complete one Skill enhancement/vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the first year.

Second Year (Under Graduate Diploma-NHEQF Level-5)

- Under Graduate Diploma for those who exit the FYUP after successfully completing I & II year (4 semesters-I, II, III, IV) of the FYUP, i.e., securing minimum 80 credits.
- Further in addition, they have to complete one Skill enhancement/vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation following the second year.

Third Year (Bachelor's Degree- NHEQF Level- 5.5)

- Bachelor's degree for those who exit the FYUP after successfully completing I, II & III years (6 semesters- I, II, III, IV, V, VI) of the FYUP i.e., securing minimum 120 credits.
- Further, they have to secure additional 2 credits under Self and social Development course work (SSD).

Fourth Year (Bachelor's Degree (Honours/ Honours with Research)- NHEQF Level- 6)

In case of UG Multidisciplinary Programmes

- Bachelor's degree (Honours/ Honours with Research): After successfully completing I, II, III & IV year (I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII & VIII semester) of the FYUP, i.e., securing



minimum 160/176 credits along with additional 2 credits under Self and Social Development course work (SSD).

In case of UG programmes with Single Major

Bachelor's degree (Honours/ Honours with Research)- After successfully completing I, II & III & IV years-8 semesters (I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII) of the FYUP, i.e., securing minimum 160 credits along with additional 2 credits under Self and Social Development course work (SSD).

Bachelor's Degree with Honours (4-Year Programme)

Upon successful completion of the three-year Bachelor's degree requirements, students may opt to continue into the fourth year of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) to pursue a Bachelor's Degree with Honours.

This programme is intended for students who wish to major in one subject while selecting another as a minor, and who aspire to gain a deeper understanding of their chosen discipline. The Honours degree spans a total of eight semesters and offers an advanced and in-depth curriculum in the major subject area.

Bachelor's Degree with Honours with Research (4-Year Programme):

Students who complete the three-year Bachelor's degree and attain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 7.5 are eligible to enroll in the fourth year to pursue a Bachelor's Degree with Honours with Research.

This programme is specifically designed for students with a strong interest in academic research. The programme places an enhanced focus on research-oriented studies alongside core disciplinary learning. Students will undertake a significant research project or dissertation in their major field during the final year, equipping them with foundational skills for postgraduate research.

Procedure for Applying for Exit from FYUP

The student after attaining minimum 44 credits/ minimum 84 credits/minimum 120+2 credits (SSD credits) may in writing request for an exit after 1year/ 2 years/ 3 years of FYUP to HoD/ Dean of their respective schools. The same request has to be further submitted to the Controller of Examinations for further necessary action.

Categories of Students Eligible for Entry and Re-entry under the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP)

Entry and Re-entry options in the FYUP will be for the following categories of students:

First Category: Those who were earlier pursuing FYUP from HNB Garhwal University (HNBGU) and exited the program in between and have re-entered without further advancement in the same programme in HNBGU.

Example: A student exited the FYUP (B.Sc.) after successfully completing first year (B.Sc. I Year - 1st & 2nd semester) from HNBGU and requested for re-entry after two years in second year (B.Sc. II Year - 3rd semester) of the same FYUP program in HNBGU.

Second Category: Those who were earlier pursuing FYUP

from HNB Garhwal University and exited the program in between and have re-entered with further advancement in the same program. Example: A student exited the FYUP after completing first year (B.A. I Year - 1st and 2nd semester) from HNBGU, pursued Second year (B.A. II Year - 3rd and 4th semester) in other University (XYZ University) and requested for reentry after one or more years in third year of the same FYUP program in HNBGU.

Third Category: Those students who were pursuing FYUP from other Universities (other than HNBGU) and have requested for entry in second, third or fourth year of FYUP of HNBGU.

Entry and Re-entry Criteria for Different Categories of Students

1. The maximum duration to qualify any FYUP will be 7 (seven) years in HNBGU, including the time spent in other Universities under same FYUP.
2. In case of first category students the re-entry will be directly provided to the students.
3. In case of second category of students, the University School level committee headed by Dean of the School(s) will scrutinize the courses pursued by the student in other Universities and will match them with the courses offered by HNBGU under the same NHEQF level. If the courses match to 70% or more in the admissible subject combination (Core Course) taken together, the student will be allowed to re-enter the FYUP in HNBGU. The re-entry will be provided subject to the availability/vacancy of the seats under the different categories.
4. If the courses do not match to 70% or more in the admissible subject combination (Core Course) taken together, the student will not be allowed to re-enter in the FYUP in HNBGU.
5. In case of third category of students, the University School level committee headed by Dean of the school(s) will scrutinize the courses pursued by the student in other Universities and will match them with the courses offered by HNBGU under the same NHEQF levels. If the courses match to 70% or more in the admissible subject combination (Core Course) taken together, the student will be allowed to enter in the FYUP in HNBGU. The entry will be provided subject to the availability/vacancy of the seats under the different categories.
6. If the courses do not match to 70% or more in the admissible subject combination (Core Course) taken together, the student will not be allowed to re-enter in the FYUP in HNBGU.

Procedure for Applying for Entry in FYUP

The student after attaining the required credits applying for entry/re-entry may have to give in writing an application to Registrar, HNB Garhwal University along with the following documents:

1. Marksheet/Course Certificate/Diploma etc. of last



session of FYUP completed.

The same request will then be forwarded to the related Dean of the School(s) for further necessary action.

The University holds the right to modify and upgrade the entry and exit procedure and other requirements, which will be duly uploaded on the University Website.

Learning Mode: Following will be the learning mode in the UG Programme:

- All courses may be conducted in blended mode, i.e., 80% offline and 20% online in Bachelor's Degree Programmes.
- Courses will be taught through Lectures, Tutorials and Practical/Field-based studies.
- Departments may offer SWAYAM/ MOOCs courses, provided the credits from such courses should not exceed the 40% of the total credits under a program.
- Students may opt for MOOC course to earn required or extra credits.

Departments offering ID and MD Courses

Following Department are offering (ID) Interdisciplinary course as an Additional subject*:

- (1) Botany and Zoology
- (2) Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, and Statistics

Note: In case of selecting I.D. course under an additional subject the student will have to study the same subject as an additional course for first 4 semesters of U.G. Program.

Example: If a student with 'Botany' and 'Zoology' as Core subjects selects 'Chemistry' as an additional subject then she/he will have to study 'Chemistry' as an additional subject in first 4 semesters (I, II, III, IV semester).

Following Schools/ Departments are offering (MD) multidisciplinary Course as an Additional subject*.

- (1) School of Humanities and Social Sciences
- (2) School of Arts, Communication and Languages
- (3) School of Commerce

Note: In case of selecting MD course under an additional subject the student will have to study one subject as an additional course in first year (I & II semesters) of U.G. Program and another subject as an additional course in another year (III & IV semesters). **Example:** If a student with 'Economics' and 'Sociology' as Core subjects selects 'History' as an additional (MD) subject for first year then she/he will have to study 'History' as an additional subject in first year (I, II semesters) and if, she/he selects 'Political Science' as an additional subject (MD) for another year then she/he will study 'Political Science' in second year (III & IV semester) as an additional multidisciplinary subject.

***This offering is not mandatory and may be interchange depending on the specific requirement of the subject**

Seat Allotment/ Intake in Additional Subject (ID or MD):

The intake of seats for core courses will be as mentioned in the university prospectus. Seats under Subjects offering ID course will be as follows:

(1) Seats under Subjects offering ID Course: Under the ID (additional course) the number of seats will be Maximum 40 percent of the total seats (Seats allocated under the admission for core subject) allocated for the Subject. However, in case, the seats/intake in any UG Programme is more than 500 in Core Courses, then 40% Additional ID seats will be considered as included in Core seats. Only in case of chemistry, Maximum 50 percent of the total seats (Seats allocated under the admission for core subject) will comprise of additional ID seats for Chemistry.

(2) Seats under Subjects offering MD Course: The total number of seats for a department for M.D course shall not exceed maximum 50 percent of the total seats (Seats allocated under the admission for core subject) allocated for the subject.

Note: The ID and MD Seats are over and above the core seats and cannot be adjusted with the core seats.

The University will have the right to change/modify the Programme/course structure or other information mentioned in admission prospectus as per UGC guidelines or NEP suggested framework in future.

Following two Multidisciplinary Programmes are offered under FYUP in the University:

- 1. Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (With Honours/ Honours with Research) in Arts:** Drawing & Painting, Economics, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Music, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology, Statistics (*Subjects*). Education (in affiliated colleges).
- 2. Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (With Honours/ Honours with Research) in Science:** Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics, Zoology (*Subjects*).

Note*: The above Multidisciplinary Programmes also contain common courses (VAC and AEC)

Four-Year Bachelor's Degree

A four-year Bachelor's degree with Honours shall be awarded upon the successful completion of 176 academic credits, along with 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), in either of the two aforementioned multidisciplinary programmes. Students will have the flexibility to choose any two subjects within their core disciplines under the selected programme. A minimum of 88 credits must be earned in the subjects belonging to the student's core discipline.

Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two core subjects/disciplines shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in a particular subject/discipline upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits in that subject out of the total 176 credits. These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) and Academic project related to the Major Subject.

Example: A student pursuing a B.A. (Honours) programme with Political Science and History as core subjects shall be awarded a Major in History if she/he earns at least 88 credits from DSC/CC, SEC (History-related), DSE courses and completes Academic project in History by the end of the eighth semester.

Additionally, the student shall be awarded a Minor in Political Science if she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits from DSC/CC, SEC (Political Science-related), and DSE courses in Political Science. A student may also be eligible for a Minor(s) in a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject or discipline if she/he completes at least 24 credits in the discipline(s) by the end of the eighth semester.

Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree-Honours with Research)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate

programme with two core subjects/disciplines shall be awarded an Honours with Research degree with a Major in one subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in that subject out of the total 176 credits. These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) and writes dissertation on the chosen major discipline.

Example: A student pursuing a B.Sc. (Honours with Research) in Physics and Chemistry as core subjects will be awarded a Major in Physics if she/he successfully completes at least 88 credits through DSC/CC, SEC (Physics-related), DSE courses, and writes dissertation on the Physics.

Such a student shall also be awarded a Minor in Chemistry if she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits through DSC/CC, SEC (Chemistry-related), and DSE courses in Chemistry. A student may also be eligible for a Minor(s) in a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject or discipline if they complete at least 24 credits in the discipline(s) by the end of the eighth semester.

As per the guidelines of the University, the departments offering a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The departments, already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme, may conduct a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the affiliating University.

Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary Programme) (In case of Exit)

Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester)

A student who chooses to exit the programme after successfully completing the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a total of 120 academic credits, including 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), from any of the aforementioned multidisciplinary programmes.

A student enrolled in a Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) with two Core subjects will be eligible for a Three-year Bachelor's Degree upon successful completion of six semesters, in the event of exiting the FYUP. If the student earns a minimum of 80 credits from the two core subjects in the Arts or Science disciplines out of the total 120 credits, she/he will be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree in Arts or Science discipline, respectively. These 80 credits of core courses must be earned through Discipline-Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the two chosen subjects.

Example: If a student exits the Four-year Bachelor's Degree programme in science after three years with Zoology and



Botany as Core subjects and has secured 80 credits from DSC/CC and SEC courses in these core Science disciplines,

they will be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree in Science.

Important Note: The student may select Minor course either from her/his second core, studied up to VI semester, or may select from the ID/MD subject they have pursued in the first and second year of their U.G. Programme.

For Example: If a student has passed UG 3 years with two core subjects i.e. Zoology and Botany, and the student have opted for Zoology as her/his Major subject in the 4th year, then the student may opt Minor courses (To be studied in VII & VIII semester) from any one subject, which could be either Botany or ID/MD subject studied by him/her in first two years of FYUP.

Course Structure and Credit Allocation

(For Subjects with Minimal or No Practical Component) (B.A.)

II. PROGRAMMES WITH SINGLE MAJOR (B.Com)

Four-Year Bachelor's Degree Programme in Commerce

A four-year Bachelor's degree (with Honours) in the aforementioned programme shall be awarded upon successful completion of 160 academic credits, along with 2 additional credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD).

Major/Minor Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 100 credits in the core subject out of the total 160 credits. These 100 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline, and Discipline Specific Electives (DSE).

Example: A student pursuing a B.Com. (Honours) programme with Commerce as the core subject will be awarded a Major in Commerce if they earn at least 100 credits in Commerce through DSC/CC, SEC, and DSE courses by the end of the eighth semester.

Additionally, such a student may be awarded a Minor in another discipline (e.g., Business Economics) if they earn a minimum of 24 credits in a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject or discipline, including credits earned through vocational courses offered in the fifth and sixth semesters.

Major/Minor under Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)

A four-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) in the aforementioned programme shall be awarded upon successful completion of 160 academic credits, along with 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD).

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and Research with a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 100 credits in the core discipline out of the total 160 credits. These credits must be earned through: Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC); Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline; Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) and a Dissertation worth 12 credits, aligned with the core subject.

Example: a student pursuing a B.Com. (Honours with Research) with Commerce as the core subject shall be awarded a Major in Commerce if they complete at least 100 credits through DSC/CC, SEC, and DSE courses in Commerce, and successfully submit a dissertation related to Commerce.

In addition, such a student may be awarded a Minor in another discipline (e.g., Business Economics) if they earn a minimum of 24 credits in a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject or discipline. This may include credits earned through Vocational Courses offered during the fifth and sixth semesters. Research Methodology and Research Writing and Ethics offered in seventh semester will be designated as Minor courses in case of such programmes under FYUP.

Note: As per the guidelines of the university, the Departments offering a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The Departments already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme may conduct a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the affiliating University.

Three-Years Undergraduate Programme with Single Major (In Case of Exit)

Major and Minor under Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester):

A student who chooses to exit the programme after the successful completion of the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a minimum of 120 academic credits, including 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), in any of the two aforementioned programmes.

A student pursuing a three-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in that discipline, upon exit after the sixth semester. To be awarded a Major, the student must have earned at least 80 credits out of the total 120 credits from the core subject. These credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC)



and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline.

Example: A student enrolled in a three-year B.Com. Programme with Commerce as the core subject will be awarded a B.Com. Degree with a Major in Commerce if they earn a minimum of 80 credits from DSC/CC and SEC courses in Commerce.

Additionally, the student may be awarded a Minor in another discipline (e.g., Business Economics) if they earn at least 24 credits in a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject or discipline, which may include credits from vocational courses offered during the fifth and sixth semesters.

The following course descriptions, course structure, and other relevant information will apply exclusively to students enrolling in undergraduate programmes for the first time in the Academic Session 2025–26:

Descriptions related to the Contents

(a) Credit

The number of credits assigned to a course reflects the minimum time commitment required by a student in the form of lectures, tutorials, and practical sessions. As per the standard academic structure:

- One credit is equivalent to one hour of classroom teaching per week, or
- Two hours of practical/tutorial work per week.

Each semester shall comprise a minimum of 20 credits. To successfully complete a semester, a student must earn the required credits by passing the prescribed examinations and fulfilling course requirements.

Selection of Major and Minor Subjects (FYUP in Arts/Science)

(b) Major Course

In the **first semester**, students are required to select one Major and one Minor subject, preferably from the same broad subject group. However, in cases where this is not feasible—either due to the student's preference or institutional constraints—students may opt their Minor subject from a different group. This flexibility shall be exercised within the framework of broad subject groups as defined by the University.

From the **second semester** onward, students will continue with three subjects: one Major, one Minor, and one Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject. A limited number of students may be allowed to change their Major and Minor subjects after the completion of the second semester, subject to their academic performance in the first semester and approval from the university authorities.

Major: The Major discipline represents the principal area of academic specialization within a degree programme. The degree shall be conferred in this discipline. The student must attain a minimum of 50% of total credits in a discipline to earn an undergraduate degree with a major in that discipline. The Major consists of a well-defined set of courses aimed at building comprehensive knowledge and competence in the subject. It includes both **Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses, Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** related to the core subject. To earn a degree with a major, students must meet the minimum credit requirements specified for different program categories.

Selection of Major and Minor Subject (FYUP in Commerce)

In the first semester, students are advised to select one Major and two Minor Interdisciplinary subjects, preferably from the same broad subject group. However, if a student so desires, or if the department/institution is unable to offer all selected subjects within the same group, the student may opt for one subject from a different group. This flexibility shall remain within the limits of the broad subject groups as defined by the University. From the second semester onward, students will continue with three subjects: one Major, one Minor, and one Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) subject.

Level of Courses offered under Major Category in different years of FYUP

Major courses in the first two semesters (I & II) will be Introductory level courses, in the next two semesters of FYUP i.e. (III & IV Semesters) they will be of Intermediate-level. Further in the third year of FYUP i.e. (V & VI semesters) they will be Higher level courses. In the fourth year of FYUP i.e., (VII & VIII semesters) the Major courses offered will be higher level courses or Advanced level courses or a combination of both level of



courses. Following are the different categories of Major courses to be offered under FYUP:

Core Course/Discipline Specific Core Course (Major):

These are mandatory courses associated with the Major discipline that every student must complete. They provide foundational and advanced knowledge essential to the core subject.

Core Elective Course/Discipline Specific Elective Course (Major):

These are optional/elective courses within the Major discipline, offered as a pool of subject-specific papers. Students are given the flexibility to select courses based on their academic interests or career goals, allowing for a degree of customization within the Major framework.

Core-Specific Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are directly aligned with the core discipline(s) chosen by the student under the FYUP. Core-specific. The skill courses aim to enhance the skills of the students based on the core courses opted by them under the FYUP. These are specialized skill-based courses aligned with the core subjects offered by the departments. Additional skill-oriented courses will also be provided under various categories. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are further available as part of the Minor Course offerings.

SEC are also offered as AMSC (Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses) in Second Year of FYUP.

Vocational Course/Field Visit/Internship: Vocational courses are designed to equip students with industry relevant skills through specialized training tailored to the needs of entrepreneurs, businesses, and industries. The objective is to ensure that graduates are employment-ready and possess the practical competencies demanded by the job market. Internships further enhance this by offering students the opportunity to work in professional environments where they can apply their classroom learning, develop workplace skills, build industry connections, and gain insights into career pathways. In addition to providing students with practical, experience-based learning, fieldwork/field visit aims to expose them to real-world socio-economic and societal challenges, allowing them to bridge the gap between

theory and practice and develop effective solutions to real life problems.

Project Report: The Project Report course under NEP 2020 aims to cultivate research aptitude, analytical thinking, and academic writing skills among students. It provides hands-on experience in identifying problems, collecting data, and presenting findings systematically. This experiential learning component enhances subject specific understanding, promotes interdisciplinary approaches, and prepares students for research-based higher education or professional roles in diverse fields.

(c) Minor Course

A Minor discipline provides students with an opportunity to broaden their knowledge and skills beyond their major discipline. The Minor courses include Discipline specific courses, skill courses, community outreach based courses and multi-disciplinary/inter-disciplinary (MD/ID) courses in the FYUP. A minimum of 32 credits will be offered under Minor Courses in a four-year undergraduate programme, while a minimum of 24 credits will be offered in a three-year undergraduate programme. Students must earn these credits through approved Minor Courses. However, to obtain a degree with a Minor in a particular subject/discipline, students must also fulfil the minimum credit requirements specified for their respective programme categories.

(c.1) Discipline Specific Minor: The Discipline Specific Minor courses include a selection of courses from a specific discipline, opted by a student, that meet the credit requirements for the minor. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will also be offered under the minor courses.

Community Outreach: The curricular component of 'Community Outreach' will involve activities that would expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.

Level of Courses offered under Discipline Specific Minor Category in different years of FYUP

Discipline Specific Minor courses in the first two



semesters (I & II) will be Introductory level courses, in the next two semesters (III & IV Semesters) they will be of Intermediate-level. Further if offered/opted in the third year (V & VI semesters) they will be Higher level courses. In the fourth year, the Discipline Specific Minor courses offered will be Higher level courses or advanced level courses or a combination of both level of courses.

(c.2) Additional Courses-ID/ MD Courses (Minor): In addition to discipline-specific minors, students enrolled in Undergraduate (UG) programmes will also have the opportunity to pursue additional minor courses, categorized as Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) courses.

In case of ID/MD courses, the students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class or equivalent grade level).

These Courses are offered alongside the core subject(s) selected at the time of enrolment and are designed to broaden students' academic exposure and enhance their skillsets beyond their primary discipline. These additional courses will be available during the first four semesters (Semesters I–IV), with an option to pursue them at a higher or an advanced level in the seventh and eighth semesters of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP).

Selection criteria for MD and ID (FYUP in Arts/Science)

Students seeking admission will have to opt two (02) interdisciplinary/ multidisciplinary (MD/ID) subjects in the first year. In the second year the student will continue with one MD/ID only.

Selection criteria for MD and ID (FYUP in Commerce)

Students seeking admission will have to select one subject under MD/ID category.

The student shall have the option to select the Interdisciplinary (ID) subject—previously not continued as a Minor—for continuation under the MD/ID category in the second year and fourth year.

Students seeking admission, opting for two core papers from two different subjects/disciplines, must select their MD/ID subject from a subject/discipline other than

those two core subjects/discipline chosen at the time of admission and one that was not studied at the 12th Class or equivalent grade level.

Departments offering additional courses as Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) options shall provide student the opportunity to pursue the same subject as an additional course from the first to the fourth semester. This means that a student who selects an ID/MD subject in the first semester will be required to continue with the same subject through the fourth semester of the undergraduate programme, with the option to pursue it again in the **seventh and eighth semesters.**

Level of Courses offered under Additional Courses-ID/MD Courses (Minor) Category in different years of FYUP

In the first two semesters (I & II) of the FYUP, Interdisciplinary/ Multidisciplinary (ID/MD) courses will be offered at the introductory level and may include skill enhancement components. In the following two semesters (III & IV), these courses will be of intermediate or higher level and may involve skill enhancement related to the ID/MD subject. If a student opts to pursue these courses as part of a Minor in the fourth year of the FYUP (i.e., in the VII and VIII semesters), they will be offered at a higher or advanced level, or as a combination of both.

Note:

1. Students shall have the option to continue pursuing the same additional course (Interdisciplinary or Multidisciplinary) as minor course in the VII and VIII semesters of the FYUP.

Departments offering ID and MD Courses

Following Schools/ Departments are offering Interdisciplinary (ID)/ Multidisciplinary (MD) Courses as an Additional subject:

Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics (**School of Sciences**); Commerce (**School of Commerce**); Geography, (**School of Earth Science**); Education [Affiliated college] (**School of Education**); Drawing & Painting, English, Hindi, Music, Sanskrit, (**School of Arts,**



Communication and Languages); Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology (**School of Humanities and Social Sciences**); Botany & Zoology (School of Life Sciences).

Value Addition Course (VAC)

These are the courses which are apart from any discipline related courses and aims to add value to the overall personality and development of an individual while focusing on areas such as life skills and personality development, Understanding and Connecting with Environment; Culture, Traditions and Moral Values, etc. It is compulsory to study all these Value-Added Courses as offered by the University in different semesters.

(d) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

These courses aim to enhance the different capabilities and abilities of the students which will help them grow in very field of life and will help in their holistic development. Indian, Modern Language, Indian Knowledge System and Communication Skills are the courses offered under the AEC. Some of the courses offered under the AEC category are designed to strengthen students' skill sets and may also be classified as Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), depending on their content and learning outcomes. Communication Skills, Indian Knowledge System and other such courses enhancing the different skillsets of the students will also be categorised under Skill Enhancement Courses.

Language Courses: Under the Indian and Modern Languages Course category, students are offered language courses designed to help them learn new languages of their choice. A pool of languages will be made available, from which students may choose to study one language in each semester and another in a subsequent semester, each carrying 2 credits.

Note:

1. In case of ID/MD courses, the students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class or equivalent grade level).
2. The University reserves the right to revise the programme/course structure or seat allotment in

accordance with UGC guidelines or the framework suggested under the NEP and University requirements.

Programmes offered under FYUP

I. Programme with Single Major in Arts and Science

Following two Bachelor's degree Programmes with single Major in Arts and Science are offered under FYUP in the University with a total of 176 credits:

1. Four Year Bachelor's Degree in Arts (Honours/ Honours with Research) with Major Subject
2. Four Year Bachelor's Degree in Science (Honours/ Honours with Research) with Major Subject

II. Other Programmes with Single Major

Following Programmes are offered under FYUP in the University with single Major with a total of 176 credits:

1. Four Year Bachelor's Degree in Commerce (Honours/ Honours with Research).

I. DETAILS OF SINGLE MAJOR PROGRAMMES IN ARTS AND SCIENCE

Following two Single Major Programmes are offered with Arts and Science as two disciplines (with a Major and Minor subjects) under FYUP in the University:

1. Four Year Bachelor's Degree in Arts (Honours/ Honours with Research) with Major Subject

The following subjects are offered under the Arts Discipline: Drawing & Painting, Economics, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Music, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology, Statistics, Education.

2. Four Year Bachelor's Degree in Science (Honours/ Honours with Research) with Major Subject

The following subjects are offered under the Science Discipline: Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics, Zoology

Note: The above Multidisciplinary Programmes also contain common courses (VAC and AEC)



Four Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary Programme)

A four-year Bachelor's degree with Honours shall be awarded upon the successful completion of 176 academic credits, in either of the two aforementioned multidisciplinary programmes. Students will have the flexibility to choose any three subjects within their core disciplines along with the MD/ID subject under the selected programme. A minimum of 88 credits must be earned in the subjects belonging to the student's Major.

Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme studying two core subjects (Major and Minor) in the first year, and pursuing one of these subjects as the Major in the second, third and fourth year, shall be eligible for the award of a Bachelor's Degree with Honours with that Major subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester. This is subject to the condition that the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits (i.e. 50% of the total credits of the programme) in the Major subject out of the total 176 credits required for the programme.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Project report and Field Visit/Vocational/ Internship course related to the Major Subject.

Example: A student pursuing a B.A. (Honours) programme with History and Political Science as core subjects and further Sociology and Economics as a Minor (ID/MD) shall be awarded a Major in History, if she/he earns at least 88 credits from DSC/CC, SEC (History-related), DSE courses, Project report, Field Visit/Vocational/Internship course in History by the end of the eighth semester.

Such a student shall also be awarded a Minor in Political Science if she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits in 8 semesters through DSC/CC, SEC (Political Science-related) and minor courses of Political Science (Offered in

III to VIII semesters).

Furthermore, the student will be awarded a Minor in Sociology or Economics (which is her/his ID/MD subject in this example) upon earning minimum 24 credits in Sociology or Economics over the span of eight semesters. This includes completing the ID/MD Sociology and Economics courses in the first four semesters, as well as the Minor courses offered under Sociology and Economics in the VII and VIII semesters.

Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year (VII & VIII semester)

In the fourth year (VII and VIII semester) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- A Discipline Specific Core subject that was studied up to the third year as a minor (i.e., until the VI semester).
- Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) subjects studied during the first and second year.

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered under the same subject in both the VII and VIII semesters.

Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree-Honours with Research)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme studying two core subjects (Major and Minor) in the first year, and pursuing one of these subjects as the Major in the second, third and fourth year, shall be eligible for the award of a Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) with that Major subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester. This is subject to the condition that the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits in the Major subject out of the total 176 credits required for the programme.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline-Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), a project report, field visits/vocational/internship courses related to the Core subject, Research methodology, and a dissertation on



the chosen major subject.

Example: A student pursuing a B.Sc. (Honours with Research) in Physics and Mathematics as Core subjects and, Statistics and Chemistry as a Minor (ID/MD) subject, will be awarded a Major in Physics if she/he successfully completes at least 88 credits through DSC/CC, SEC (Physics-related), DSE courses, Project report, Field Visit/ Vocational/ Internship course of Physics, Research Methodology Course and writes dissertation (12 Credits) on the Physics.

Such a student shall also be awarded a Minor in Mathematics if she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits in period of 8 semesters through DSC/CC, SEC (Chemistry-related) and minor courses of Mathematics (offered in III & VIII semesters).

Furthermore, the student will be awarded a Minor in Statistics/Chemistry (which is her/his ID/MD subject in this example) upon earning 24 credits in Statistics/Chemistry over the span of eight semesters. This includes completing the ID/MD Statistics/Chemistry courses in the first four semesters, as well as the Minor courses offered under Statistics/Chemistry in the VII and VIII semesters.

Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year (VII & VIII semester)

In the fourth year (VII and VIII semesters) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- A Discipline Specific Core subject that was studied up to the third year as a Minor (i.e., until the VI semester).
- Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) subjects studied during the first and second year.

To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme. If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered under the same subject in both the VII and VIII semesters.

Note: The Departments offering a 4-year UG Degree

(Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The Departments already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme may conduct a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the affiliating University.

Three Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary Programme)

(In case of Exit under FYUP)

Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (As an exit option after VI Semester under FYUP)

A student who opts to exit the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) after successfully completing six semesters shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree with a Major in one subject, provided she/he has earned a minimum of 64 credits in the major discipline out of a total of 128 academic credits. These credits must be earned from any of the multidisciplinary undergraduate programmes offered.

In the case of a student, enrolled in the FYUP with two core subjects, she/he shall be eligible for a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree with a Single Major, provided she/he has earned at least 64 credits in one Core subject (from Arts or Science disciplines). These 64 credits must be accrued through Discipline-Specific Core (DSC)/Core Courses (CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), and other related courses in the chosen major subject.

Example: If a student exits a Four-Year Bachelor's Degree programme in science (Zoology & Botany as Core subjects) after three years and has earned 64 credits in Zoology through DSC/CC, SEC, DSE, and other courses offered under the subject Zoology, she/he will be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree in Science with a Major in Zoology.

Similarly, the student, who has studied Botany as a minor core subject, shall be awarded a Minor in Botany,



provided they earn a minimum of 24 credits from DSC/CC and SEC courses in Botany over the span of six semesters.

Guidelines for selecting/pursuing a Minor in the third Year

The students will have to select Minor from one of the two Core courses pursued by them in first year i.e. first 2

semesters of the FYUP.

Example: If a student has taken Botany as a minor core subject and continues with it as a minor in the second and third year, she/he shall be awarded a Minor in Botany, provided she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits from DSC/CC and SEC courses in Botany over the span of six semesters.

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, they must undertake the Minor courses offered by that subject in both the 7th and 8th semesters.

Example: If a student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two Core subjects—Botany and Chemistry—opts to pursue Chemistry as her/his Major and Botany as Minor in the first three years, she/he will have the option to continue with Botany as a Minor in the seventh and eighth semesters, i.e., the fourth year of the FYUP.

Alternatively, if the same student had studied Statistics and Zoology as an Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Statistics or Zoology as her/his Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the duration of the programme.

Fourth Year UG (Honours with Research) (B.Sc.) (For Practical based Subjects)

The following course structure under FYUP for Multidisciplinary programmes is designed for subjects which have practical based courses or have relatively larger emphasis on practical course-based learning:

The student shall be required to continue with the same Major subject as pursued in the third year of the Undergraduate Programme.

- A Discipline Specific Core subject that was studied up to the third year as a minor (i.e., until the VI semester).

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, they must undertake the Minor courses offered by that subject in both the VII and VIII semesters.

Example: If a student, enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two Core subjects—Botany and Chemistry—opts to pursue Chemistry as her/his Major and Botany as Minor in the first three years, she/he will have the option to continue with Botany as a Minor in the seventh and eighth semesters, i.e., the fourth year of the FYUP. Alternatively, if the same student had studied Statistics and Zoology as an Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Statistics or Zoology as their Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme.

**Curriculum Framework and Credit Allocation for Subjects
with Minimal or No Practical Component (B.A.)**

- **Community Outreach:** The curricular component of 'Community Outreach' will involve activities that would expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.

Fourth Year (NHEQF Level-6) (B.A.)

In the fourth Year of Four-Year Undergraduate Program (FYUP) two types of programmes are offered:

1. **UG with Honours**
2. **UG Honours with Research**

Candidates with a minimum CGPA of 7.5 will be eligible to continue their studies into the fourth year of the undergraduate program, leading to a four-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research).

Fourth Year (UG Honours) (B.A.)

The following course structure under FYUP for Multidisciplinary programmes is designed for subjects which do not have practical based courses or have minimal emphasis on practical course-based learning:

The student shall be required to continue with the same Major subject as pursued in the third year of the Undergraduate Programme.

Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year:

In the fourth year (VII and VIII semesters) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) subject studied during the first and second year (I to IV semesters) Or
- A Discipline specific core subject that was studied up to the third year as a minor (i.e., until the VI semester).

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered by that subject in both the VII and VIII semesters. Example: If a student is enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two Core subjects Economics and Political Science, and chooses Economics as Major and Political Science as Minor, then Political Science will be her/his Minor in the third year, with the option to continue pursuing Political Science as a Minor in the VII and VIII semesters, i.e., the fourth year of the FYUP.

Alternatively, if the same student had studied Sociology/Philosophy as an Interdisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Sociology or Philosophy as Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the duration of the programme.



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Fourth Year-UG (Honours with Research) (B.A.)

In the following course structure under FYUP for Multidisciplinary programmes is designed for subjects which do not have practical based courses or have minimal emphasis on practical course-based learning:

In the fourth year (VII and VIII semesters) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) subject studied during the first and second year (I to IV semesters) or
 - A Discipline Specific Core subject that was studied up to the third year as a Minor (i.e., until the VI semester).
- If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered by that subject in both the VII & VIII semesters.

Example: If a student is enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two Core subjects Economics and Political and chooses Economics as Major and Political Science as Minor, then Political Science will be her/his Minor in the third year, with the option to continue pursuing Political Science as a Minor in the VII and VIII semesters, i.e., the fourth year of the FYUP.

Alternatively, if the same student had studied Sociology/Philosophy as an Interdisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Sociology or Philosophy as Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme.

II. OTHER PROGRAMMES WITH SINGLE MAJOR (B.Com.)

Following four Programmes are offered under FYUP in the University with single Major:

Four Year Bachelor's Degree Programme with Single Major

A four-year Bachelor's degree (with Honours) in the B.Com shall be awarded upon successful completion of **176 academic credits**.

Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours)

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be

awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in the core subject out of the total 176 credits.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Project report and Field Visit/Vocational/ Internship course and other courses related to the Major Subject.



Example: A student pursuing a B.Com. (Honours) programme with Commerce as the Major Core subject and Financial Management and Business Economics as Minor Core subjects, along with Gender Studies as an Interdisciplinary/ Multidisciplinary Minor, will be awarded a Major in Commerce if she/he earns at least 88 credits through DSC/CC, SEC (Commerce-related), DSE courses, project work, field visits, vocational courses, or internships related to Commerce by the end of the eighth semester.

Such a student shall also be awarded a Minor in Business Economics if she/he earns a minimum of 24 credits in 8 semesters through DSC/CC, SEC (Business Economics - related) and minor courses of Business Economics. (offered in I to VIII semesters).

Furthermore, the student will be awarded a Minor in Gender Studies (which is her/his ID/MD subject in this example) upon earning 24 credits in Gender Studies over the span of eight semesters. This includes completing the ID/MD Gender Studies courses in the first four semesters, as well as the Minor courses offered under Gender studies in the VII and VIII semesters.

Major/ Minor under Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)

A four-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) in the aforementioned programmes shall be awarded upon successful completion of 176 academic credits.

A student, enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline, shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and Research with a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in the core major discipline out of the total 176 credits. These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Project report and Field Visit/Vocational/ Internship course related to the Major Subject, Research Methodology Course including the Dissertation worth 12 credits, aligned with the Core major subject.

Example: A student pursuing a B.Com. (Honours) programme with Commerce as the Major Core subject and Financial Management and Business Economics as Minor Core subjects, along with Gender Studies as an Interdisciplinary/ Multidisciplinary Minor, will be awarded a Major in Commerce upon successful completion of at least 88 credits. These credits must be earned through DSC/CC, SEC, and DSE courses in Commerce, a project report, field visits/vocational training/internships related to the major subject, a course in research methodology, and the successful submission of a dissertation in the field of Commerce.

Such a student shall also be awarded a Minor in Business Economics if they earn a minimum of 24 credits in 8 semesters through DSC/CC, SEC (Business Economics-related) and

minor courses of Business Economics (offered in I to VIII semesters).

Furthermore, the student will be awarded a Minor in Gender studies (which is his/her ID/MD subject in this example) upon earning 24 credits in Gender studies over the span of eight semesters. This includes completing the ID/MD. Gender Studies courses in the first four semesters, as well as the Minor courses offered under Gender Studies in the VII and VIII semesters.

Note: As per the guidelines of the University The Departments offering a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The Departments already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme may conduct a 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the affiliating University.

Three Years Under Graduate Programme with Single Major (In Case of Exit)

Major and Minor under Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester)

A student who chooses to exit the programme after the successful completion of the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a minimum of 128 academic credits.

A student pursuing a three-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in that discipline, upon exit after the sixth semester. To be awarded a Major, the student must have earned at least 64 credits out of the total 128 credits from the Core subject. These credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), Project report and Field Visit/Vocational/Internship course related to the Major Subject.

Example: A student pursuing a B.Com. (Honours) programme with Commerce as the Major Core subject and Business Economics and Financial Management as Minor Core subject and further Gender Studies as Minor (ID/MD subject) shall be awarded a Major in Commerce if she/he earns a minimum of 64 credits from DSC/CC and SEC courses, Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), Project report and Field Visit/Vocational courses/Internship in Commerce.

Additionally, the student may be awarded a Minor in another discipline (e.g., Business Economics) if she/he earns at least 24 credits in a Minor subject.

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject in the fourth year of FYUP, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered under that subject in both the VII and VIII semesters.

Example: If a student was enrolled in a 4-year undergraduate programme with Commerce as Core Major subject and Financial Management and Business Economics as Minor subjects, and further she/he has opted Business Economics as Minor, then in this case the student will have the option to pursue Business Economics as her/his Minor in the VII and VIII semesters of fourth year.

Alternatively, if the same student had studied Gender Studies as an Interdisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Gender Studies as Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

The student shall have the option to select the Interdisciplinary (ID) subject—previously not continued as a Minor—for continuation under the MD/ID category in the second year and fourth year (For instance, Financial Management as mentioned in the above example).

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme.

Minor: Each department is required to design and offer higher or advanced level Minor courses (one in each semester of the fourth year) that broaden the learner's academic exposure beyond their Core Major discipline.

Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year:

In the fourth year (VII and VIII semesters) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- Interdisciplinary (ID) or Multidisciplinary (MD) subject studied during the first and second year (I to IV semesters) Or
- A minor subject studied up to the third year (i.e., until the VI semester).

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject in the fourth year of FYUP, she/he must undertake the Minor courses offered under that subject in both the VII and VIII semesters.

Example: If a student was enrolled in a 4-year undergraduate programme with Commerce as Core Major subject and Financial Management and Business Economics as Minor subjects, and further she/he has opted Business Economics as Minor, then in this case the student will have the option to pursue Business Economics as Minor in the VI and VIII semesters of fourth year.

Alternatively, if the same student had studied Gender Studies as an Interdisciplinary (ID/MD) subject in the first and second year, she/he may opt for Gender Studies as Minor in the VII & VIII semesters i.e. fourth year.

The student shall have the option to select the Interdisciplinary (ID) subject—previously not continued as a Minor—for continuation under the MD/ID category in the second year and fourth year (For instance, Financial Management as mentioned in the above example).

Credit Requirement for Minor: To earn a Minor in a particular subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme.

BROAD CATEGORY OF SUBJECTS

The subjects have been classified into eight distinct groups to facilitate more meaningful and academically productive combinations for students. However, selection from these groups remains advisory and flexible, allowing students the autonomy to explore interdisciplinary interests.

I. Two Subjects (01-Major and 01-Minor)

In the first semester, students are advised to select one Major and one Minor subject, preferably from the same subject group. However, if a student wishes to, or if the department/institution is unable to offer both subjects from the same group, the student may choose one subject from a different group. This flexibility is limited to combinations within Group 1, 2 & 3 or within Group 4 & 5 only.

SUBJECT GROUPS

1. **Natural and Physical Sciences:** Zoology, Chemistry, Botany, Physics, Geology, Geography
2. **Mathematical, Statistics, and Computational Sciences:** Mathematics, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry
3. **Earth Science:** Geography
4. **Humanities and Social Sciences:** Sociology, Political Science, Economics, History, Psychology, Education, Geography

5. **Art and Languages:** Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Drawing and Painting, Music

6. Management and Commerce

II. Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary Subjects (Two-02)

SELECTION OF MAJOR AND MINOR FROM THE SUBJECT GROUP(S)

Student will select the 02 MD/ID from any one or more broad subject category from which Major and Minor has been selected, i.e. within 1,2,3 or within 4 & 5 subject.

Students are not allowed to take the same courses studied in the 12th class under the Multidisciplinary subject (MD /Interdisciplinary (ID) category.

Second Year (FYUP)

Major & Minor: After the successful completion of II semester the student will pursue one Major and one Minor as selected in the first year.

Major & Minor: In case of MD and ID the student will only continue with one MD/ID course in the second year.

HNBGU Curriculum and Credit Framework for

POSTGRADUATE (PG) PROGRAMMES UNDER NEP 2020 [w.e.f. ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26]

Categories of PG Programmes

1-Year PG Programme: Students who hold a 4-year undergraduate degree with Honours or Honours with Research shall be eligible to enroll in a 1-year postgraduate (PG) programme in their respective or related disciplines.

2-Year PG Programme: Students who did not pursue or are not eligible to pursue the 4-year undergraduate programme (Honours/Honours with Research) will have the opportunity to enrol in a 2-year postgraduate (PG) programme upon completion of their three-year undergraduate degree.

Additionally, students who have completed professional undergraduate degrees, such as B.E. or B.Tech., will have to enrol in a 2-year PG programme to pursue postgraduate studies in their respective disciplines.

Duration of the PG Programmes

The PG will be of 1-year, 2-year, and an integrated 5-year with multiple entry and exit options after fulfilling the required conditions as per "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Postgraduate Programmes" of University Grants Commission. The maximum duration to earn/complete any post graduate degree will be as follows:

- For 2-year PG programme the maximum duration will be four years.
- For 1-year PG programme the maximum duration will be three years.
- For an Integrated 5-year programme the maximum duration will be eight years

NOTE: 1-YEAR PG PROGRAMME WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN THE UNIVERSITY FROM ACADEMIC SESSION 2026-27.

Description of PG Programmes

The PG programmes will be aligned with the **National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF)** levels, as detailed below:

NHEQF Level-6

Postgraduate Diploma: duration: One year (two semesters) for those who exit after successful completion of the first year (two semesters) of the 2-year Master's degree programme.

NHEQF Level-6.5

2-year PG: Master's degree. (e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.) duration: Two years (four semesters) after obtaining a 3-year Bachelor's degree (e.g. B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. etc.).

NHEQF Level-6.5

1-year PG: Master's degree. (e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.) duration: One year (two semesters) after obtaining a 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours/ Honours with Research) (e.g. B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. etc.).

Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit

In accordance with the Multiple Entry and Exit provisions outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, students will be offered flexible exit and re-entry options aligned with the corresponding National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) levels and their respective academic requirements.

Postgraduate Diploma (NHEQF Level-6)

- Duration: One year (two semesters)
- Requirements for earning PG Diploma: For those who exit after successful completion of the first year (two semesters) of the 2-year Master's degree programme i.e., securing minimum 48 credits.

2-Year PG (NHEQF Level-6.5) [e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.]

- duration and eligibility for entry: Two years (four semesters); for students who have obtained a 3-year Bachelor's degree.
- Requirements for earning 2-Year Masters's Degree: For those who successfully completes Two years (four



semesters) of the 2-year Master's degree programme i.e., securing minimum 96 credits.

1-Year PG (NHEQF Level-6.5) [e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.]

- duration and eligibility for entry: One year (Two semesters), for students who have obtained a 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours/ Honours with Research),
- Requirements for earning **1-Year Master's Degree**: For those who successfully complete one year (two semesters) of the 1-year Master's degree programme i.e., securing minimum 48 credits.
- **Requirements for earning Master's Degree**: For those who successfully complete two years (four semesters) of the 2-year Master's degree programme i.e., securing minimum 96 credits.

Procedure for applying for exit from PG

The student after attaining minimum 48 credits may in writing request for an exit after One-year of 2-Year PG programme to HoD/ Dean of their respective school. Such applications shall be forwarded by HoD/Dean to the Controller of Examinations for further necessary action.

Categories of Students Eligible for Entry and Re-entry under the PG

Entry and Re-entry options in the PG will be for the following categories of students:

First Category: Students who were earlier pursuing 2-Year PG from HNB Garhwal University (HNBGU) and exited the in between and have re-entered without further advancement in the same in HNBGU. Example: A student exited the M.Sc. Chemistry after successfully completing first year (M.Sc. I Year i.e. 1st and 2nd semesters) from HNBGU and requested for re-entry after two years in second year (M.Sc. II Year i.e. 3rd semester) of the same PG in HNBGU.

Second Category: Students who were pursuing PG from universities other than HNBGU and have requested for entry in second year of PG of HNBGU.

Entry and Re-entry Criteria for different Categories of Students

1. The maximum duration to earn any postgraduate degree will be as follows:
 - a. For 2-year PG programme the maximum duration will be four years;
 - b. For 1-year PG programme the maximum duration will be three years, including the time spent in other Universities under same PG.
2. In case of first category students the re-entry will be directly provided to the students.
3. In case of second category of students, the University Department level committee headed by Head of the Department/ Dean of the School will scrutinize the courses pursued by the student in other universities and will match them with the admissible Core Courses offered by HNBGU under the same NHEQF levels. If the courses match is 70% or more of the total admissible Core Courses offered by HNBGU

the student will be allowed to enter the PG programme in HNBGU. The entry will be provided subject to the availability/vacancy of the seats under the different categories.

If the courses match is less than 70% of the admissible total Core Courses offered by HNBGU the student will not be allowed to enter into the PG programme in HNBGU.

Procedure for applying for entry from PG programme

The student after attaining the required credits applying for entry/re-entry may have to give in writing an application to Registrar, HNBGU along with following documents:

1. Marksheet/Course Certificate/Diploma etc. of Last session of PG programme completed. The same request will be thereby forwarded to the Dean of the related School for further necessary action.

Note: The University holds the right to modify and upgrade the entry and exit procedure and other requirements, which will be duly uploaded in the University Website.

Eligibility for admission in First semester of PG programme

- (i) In case of PG programme, no student shall be eligible for admission unless he/she has successfully passed the Three Year UG or Four-Year UG programme from the University recognized by the Central/State Governments for this purpose or its equivalent.
- (ii) Minimum pass percentage in pre-PG class for admission in the first semester of PG programme under different caste categories will be as per the recommendations of the admission committee.

Basic description of eligibility for PG programme

- (i) The students having 4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research/ Honours) will have an option to get enrolled in 1-Year PG Programme.
- (ii) Those students who have passed 3-Year UG programme and do not opt for/or are not eligible for 4 years UG (Honours/ Honours with Research) will have the option to get enrolled in 2-Year PG programme.
- (iii) In case of exit after successful completion (securing minimum 48 credits) of first year of the 2-Year PG Programme, the student will get a Post-Graduate Diploma in concerned discipline.

Learning mode

Following will be the learning mode in the PG programme:

- All courses may be conducted in blended mode, i.e., 80% offline and 20% online in Master's Degree.
- Courses will be taught through Lectures, Tutorials and Practical/field-based studies.
- Departments may offer SWAYAM/ MOOCs Courses, provided the credits from such courses should
- not exceed the 40% of the total credits under a programme.
- Students may opt for MOOC course to earn required or extra credits.



Note: The University will have the right to change/modify the /course structure or other information mentioned in

prospectus as per UGC guidelines or NEP suggested framework in future.

EXAMINATION RULES

The university examination schedule and rules of promotions as prescribed by the HNB Garhwal University will be applicable. Students are required to fill online University examination forms with requisite fees and deposit the hard copies in the college office as per schedule of the university. No separate intimation will be given for that. The answer sheets of the sessional/practical examination will be kept by the department only for one year from the date of the declaration of the result of that class by the university. After 365 days of the declaration of the result by the university, no request, regarding the answer sheets will be entertained by the college.



ATTENDANCE RULES

- (a) The teacher handling a course shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have registered for the course.
 - (b) All teachers shall intimate the Head of the Department at least seven calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 75% attendance in one or more courses.
 - (c) A candidate who has less than 75% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. However, it shall be open to the concerned Dean(s) to grant exemption to a candidate who has failed to obtain the prescribed 75% attendance for valid reasons and such exemptions shall not under any circumstances be granted for attendance below 65%. (d) A candidate who fails to put in at least 75% attendance in I semester shall not be allowed to pursue the studies in II semester. Such candidates may apply to the Dean of the concerned school for re-registration in the I semester in the next academic session. A candidate who fails to put in at least 75% attendance in the II semester shall not be promoted to III semester. Such candidates may apply to the Dean of the school for re-registration in the II semester in the next academic session and so on and so forth.
- PASS AND PROMOTION CRITERIA (UG & PG PROGRAMMES)**
- The following provisions shall be applicable to students admitted to the Four-Year Undergraduate programmes under National Education Policy (NEP 2020):
- (a) A student who appears in an odd semester examination or who was eligible to appear in the odd semester examinations but remains absent in any or all the papers of the said semester, shall move on to the next even semester irrespective of her/his result in the said examinations.
 - (b) A student who puts in 75% attendance in I and II semesters of a UG programme separately but fails to acquire 20 credits in I and II semester examinations taken together shall not be promoted to III semester. She/He shall cease to be a regular student.
 - (c) If a student is unable to obtain the minimum credit requirement for promotion to the next academic year, she/he may still be eligible for promotion provided that the total credits earned in the immediate previous year are not less than the total required credits minus the credits of any one semester of that year.
 - (d) Promotion to VII semester of FYUP (Honours with Research) will be allowed only if the student gets 7.5 CGPA (75 % marks) till successful completion of all 6 semesters.
 - (e) Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria mentioned above shall be declared fail in the examination of the academic year concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers which they want to retain.
 - (f) There will not be any provision of grace marks/grade(s) in any paper /semester exam.
 - (g) The candidate obtaining Grade 'F' is considered failed and will be required to clear the arrears in the subsequent examinations within the stipulated time. A student may appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed for semester I/III/V/VII only in the odd semester examinations to be held in November-December. A student who wants to appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed in even semester II/IV/VI/VIII may do so only in the examinations to be held in May/June.
 - (h) The students who remain absent in sessional/end semester examination shall be deemed to have failed in that subject. In case of end semester examination, he/she may reappear in the failed course with maximum three attempts, as back paper examination, provided she/he pays the fees as prescribed by the University. In case of absence in sessional examination, she/he may reappear in the same semester in the immediate next academic session with a fee as prescribed by the University. Re-appearance in internal assessment for improvement shall not be allowed.
 - (i) In case of practical examination/Dissertation/Field Reports the internal assessment will be based on the continuous evaluation (viva, performance in class test, maintenance of performance record, etc.) during entire semester. The internal assessment in such cases will be of 30 marks.



- (j) A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible only for CGPA and grade but not for ranking of candidates in the University. Only the candidates who pass all the semester examinations in first attempts are eligible for ranking, when required.
- (k) There shall be no supplementary examinations.

The following provisions shall be applicable to students admitted to the Postgraduate programmes under National Education Policy (NEP 2020):

- (a) A student who appears in an odd semester examination or who was eligible to appear in the odd semester examinations but remains absent in any or all the papers of the said semester, shall move on to the next even semester irrespective of his/her result in the said examinations.
- (b) A student who puts in 75% attendance in I and II semesters of a PG programme separately but fails to acquire 24 credits in I and II semester examinations taken together shall not be promoted to III semester. She/He shall cease to be a regular student.
- (c) Subject to putting 75% attendance in Odd and even semesters, Promotion from odd semester to even semester will be automatic (i.e., from semester 1st to 2nd and from 3rd semester to 4th semester). But for promotion to next year, the minimum credit requirement will be total credits till the end of that particular year minus 24 credits (maximum arrears of credits of 1 semester is allowed), viz., minimum credit requirement for admission to 3rd semester is 24.
- (d) If a student is unable to obtain the minimum credit requirement for promotion to the next academic year, they may still be eligible for promotion provided that the total credits earned in the immediate previous year are not less than the total required credits minus the credits of any one semester of that year.
- (e) Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria mentioned above shall be declared fail in the examination of the academic year concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers which they want to retain.
- (f) There will not be any provision of grace marks/grade(s) in any paper / semester exam.
- (g) The candidate obtaining Grade 'F' is considered failed and will be required to clear the arrears in the subsequent examinations within the stipulated time. A

student may appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed for semester I/III only in the odd semester examinations to be held in November-December. A student who wants to appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed in even semester II/IV may do so only in the examinations to be held in May/June.

- (h) The students who remain absent in sessional/end semester examination shall be deemed to have failed in that subject. In case of end semester examination, she/he may reappear in the failed course with maximum three attempts, as back paper examination, provided he/she pays the fees as prescribed by the University. In case of absence in sessional examination, she/he may reappear in the same semester in the immediate next academic session with a fee as prescribed by the University. Re-appearance in internal assessment for improvement shall not be allowed.
- (i) In case of practical examination/Dissertation/Field Reports the internal assessment will be based on the continuous evaluation (viva, performance in class test, maintenance of performance record, etc.) during entire semester. The internal assessment in such cases will be of 40 marks.
- (j) A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible only for CGPA and grade but not for ranking of candidates in the University. Only the candidates who pass all the semester examinations in first attempt are eligible for ranking, when required.
- (k) There shall be no supplementary examinations.

SAMARTH E-GOV ADMISSION PORTAL

The Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University (HNBGU) manages and facilitates the admission process to all undergraduate (UG), postgraduate (PG), diploma, PG Diploma and Ph.D. Programmes through centralized **SAMARTH e-Gov Admission Portal/Platform**.

It is mandatory for all the applicants to register on SAMARTH Portal for admission in DAV PG College Dehradun.

Steps for Student Registration on SAMARTH Portal:

1. Visit the HNBGU SAMARTH Admission Portal-Affiliated College.
2. Click on **"New Registration"** or **use the credentials for login on to the Portal**.
3. After logging in, Fill up your Profile detail:

It includes all the personal details regarding category, place of birth, family, address etc.

Note: Check thoroughly all the entries of your profile details before final submission.

Once submitted, editing will not be permitted.

4. Programme Selection:

Choose the programme you want to apply → Fill up all your details like personal, academic, others, and upload the required documents → Pay the application fee online.

Applicant should read the Admission Prospectus carefully regarding the eligibility of the programme. For example, for those who apply for LL.M, should have LL.B in bachelor degree.

Note: Check thoroughly all the entries of your profile details before final submission. Once submitted, editing will not be permitted.

5. If you want to apply for more than one programme, repeat the step 4 only. Steps 1 to 3 need not to be repeated. You need to pay application fee as per the

instruction issued by the University. Applicant cannot apply for more than three (03) programmes.

Note: Students are required to complete the registration process on or before the specified deadline to ensure uninterrupted access to academic services.

After the successful registration, the concerned authority of the University will review and verify the submitted application forms. In accordance with the admission policy for the academic session, the Admission Committee constituted for various Programmes/Courses shall shortlist the eligible applicants and prepare merit lists for admission. The shortlisted applicants are then required to log in to the Admission Portal and complete the Admission Process by paying the prescribed fee online.

डी.ए.वी. (पी.जी.) कॉलेज, देहरादून

121 वर्ष की यशस्वी यात्रा

(दयानन्द शिक्षा संस्थान कानपुर द्वारा संचालित)

सन् 1824 ई0 में भारतीय मेधा के मनस्वी महर्षि दयानन्द सरस्वती का आविर्भाव हुआ। इस परम तेजस्वी मनीषी ने 'आर्य-समाज' के माध्यम से ऐसी अलख जगाई कि सम्पूर्ण राष्ट्र अभिभूत हो उठा। कालान्तर में स्वामी दयानन्द जी के देहावसान के उपरान्त महात्मा हंसराज जी के निर्देशन में सर्वप्रथम डी.ए.वी. कॉलेज ट्रस्ट एवं प्रबन्ध समिति के प्रथम स्कूल की स्थापना 1 जून, 1886 ई0 को लाहौर (अब पाकिस्तान) में हुई। महात्मा हंसराज जी की प्रेरणा से प्रेरित इस महाविद्यालय की स्थापना सन् 1892 में मेरठ में एक रात्रिकालीन संस्कृत पाठशाला के रूप में हुई, जिसकी प्रबन्ध समिति को सन् 1904 ई0 में देहरादून के दानवीर ठाकुर पूर्ण सिंह नेगी ने भू-सम्पत्ति दान में दी, जिसके फलस्वरूप यह स्कूल मेरठ से देहरादून स्थानान्तरित हो गया। सन् 1922 में यह स्कूल इण्टरमीडिएट कॉलेज, सन् 1946 में डिग्री कॉलेज और सन् 1948 में पी.जी. कॉलेज बना।

सन् 1892 में कानपुर में गठित डी.ए.वी. कॉलेज ट्रस्ट एण्ड मैनेजमेंट सोसाइटी के संस्थापक अध्यक्ष बाबू ज्योति स्वरूप थे। तदुपरान्त सोसायटी के संचालन का दायित्व कानुपर के श्री आनन्द स्वरूप जी ने संभाला। तदनन्तर उनके छोटे भाई बाबू बृजेन्द्र स्वरूप जी ने इस दायित्व का सम्यक् निर्वहन किया। 30 मार्च 1960 को बाबू बृजेन्द्र स्वरूप जी के स्वर्गवासी हो जाने के उपरान्त उनके छोटे पुत्र डॉ. वीरेन्द्र स्वरूप जी ने अपनी अप्रतिम प्रतिभा और सामाजिक नेतृत्व के बल पर शिक्षा-जगत् के प्रतीक पुरुष के रूप में ख्याति अर्जित की।

डॉ0 वीरेन्द्र स्वरूप जी के निधन के उपरान्त उनके ज्येष्ठ पुत्र श्री जगेन्द्र स्वरूप जी के कंधों पर दयानन्द शिक्षा

दयानन्द शिक्षा संस्थान उत्तर प्रदेश के कानपुर, उन्नाव, लखनऊ और

बछरावाँ (रायबरेली) में स्थित 19 अन्य संस्थाओं एवं उत्तराखण्ड राज्य के देहरादून जिले में डी.ए.वी. महाविद्यालय सहित पाँच संस्थाओं का संचालन करता है।
